

YOUTH RALLY

As the leading event to kick off the Youth Revival, the Fairview youth conducted a

Rally at the church on Saturday, August 20. This event was open to the surrounding communities to come together. The activities for the day catered to the youth featuring B-Les, the Christian Hip-Hop artist, formerly a member of the group Mobsters of Light. The day was packed with activities including dancing and poetry, and prepared the young people to go higher in Christ. Beginning with the Rally on Saturday and continuing with the Revival the remainder of the week, Fairview's Youth enjoyed spirit-filled fun and showed that the Youth of Fairview really are KRUNC for CHRIST. Why KRUNC? Because our Youth at Fairview are Kids Rejoicing Under Negative Circumstances -- WE KRUNC!!!!

REVIVAL—Sunday Morning

The Theme chosen for this year's revival was **We Are All Witnesses**, with the scripture reference Acts 1:8. The Revival began on Sunday Morning with Reverend Derek Nettles, Fairview's Youth Pastor, bringing the morning message. His subject was "**I've Got Issues**" and his text was based on Mark 5: 24-34 regarding the woman with the issue of blood for 12 long years. His dynamic message and delivery brought to light several key points:

- Like the woman with the issue of blood man of us deal with the same problem or challenge year after year. Just as Jesus was her answer He is our answer.
- The value of a woman in this time was derived from her ability to marry and birth children. The inability to bear children was like a death sentence, very likely meaning she would be broke all of her life and not worth much based on Jewish society at this time. The issues we face may cause us to feel down, out and worthless. Just like the woman we may feel the issues we have wrestled with over and over have left us near death, which bring us to Reverend Nettles last point.
- Based on the volume of blood she was losing daily for 12 years, why wasn't she already dead? The answer is because God had His hands on her. Losing so much blood, Reverend Nettles calculated that the woman with the issue of blood should have died 78 times, yet God had His hands on her. The message for us is that only God can preserve us.

In this message, Reverend Nettles painted a picture of what this woman must have looked like after dealing with 12 years of

bleeding. I imagined her looking more like someone suffering form starvation as a result of Hitler and the Holocaust; weak, thin, sunken eye sockets and pale skin. Reverend Nettles further painted the picture that such extensive bleeding would cause sever bruising of the skin. This woman hung out with others who shared her condition or her condemnation. When she heard the stories about Jesus and decided to go to Him, surely her "friends" tried to talk her out of that decision. In Jewish society she was considered "unclean" and was forbidden from being seen in public, and as shocking as she must have looked, she would be easily discovered.

She ignored the warnings and went to Jesus anyway. This broken, feeble, outcast woman tried everything else and so Jesus was her last option. We must tell others about Jesus just as someone told this woman. We must remember the *lessons learned*:

- I am important to God,
- God has His hands on me,
- Don't be discouraged by crowds,
- Only Jesus gave her peace and healing.

REVIVAL-Monday thru Wednesday

The Revival continued nightly at 7:00 PM. The guest Evangelist was Reverend Broderick Huggins, pastor of St. Paul Baptist Church of Oxnard, California. In Dr. Huggins words, he was Hippopotamus Glad and Elephant Happy to be invited to Fairview for this year's revival. Each night, he brought a powerful message for our youth and for adults as well.

The information compacted into the messages from Dr. Huggins, along with his unique, captivating method of presentation, was more than could be captured on paper! Suggestion -- get the video! On Monday night he laid the foundation and, to some, introduced himself and his dynamic method of exposition with the message, "Honor, the Language of Love," I Peter 2:13. His inclusion of impressions, at times through melody, proved that he not only preaches but sing as well! His sermons were such that worshippers of all ages could understand the intended message. Tuesday night's message was "Don't Hang Yourself," Matthew 27:1-5, and Wednesday night, he closed with "The Psychology of a Fighter," I Samuel 17:22-32.

Throughout the week, Fairview youth were spotlighted and several guest churches, artists and groups joined in as witnesses for HIM. Special incentives and challenges were presented to the youth nightly to keep their interest and enthusiasm, including High Attendance Night on Tuesday night, Pizza Night on Wednesday night and the KRUNC contest between the boys and girls.

Hats off to Reverend Nettles, Youth Pastor, and other youth workers for the job well done!
