






"Farther along we'll know all about it, Farther along we'll understand why; Cheer up, my brother, live in the sunshine, We'll understand it all by and by."



THE COMMUNICATIONS AND PUBLIC RELATIONS MINISTRY (CPR) of Fairview Baptist Church held its 6th Annual Communications Conference February 28 and March 1. The theme is "Rebranding the Church for the 21st Century: Communicating by the Power of the Holy Spirit."

This year's Conference was expanded to include a full day on Friday. The session, "What's That in Your Hand? - Confronting the Fear of Technology," was an informal, comeand-go schedule with an open-ended format designed to provide hands-on support in the use of various electronic devices such as I-Pads, notebooks and tablets, cell phones/smartphones, laptops, as well as basic tips on navigating the computer, digital cameras, etc.

Mentors, Sharda Allen, Angela "Candy" Montgomery, Levi McCullough, ShayLa Taylor and Paula McGlory were on hand during the conference to assist attendees in the use of electronic devices in ministry as well as in their personal Fears were put to rest and everyone was in for a real treat when Candy taught about live streaming, video sharing, and gadgets that will turn a television into a smart Talk about photo albums T.V. collecting dust on the shelf, well there is hope for you all. Candy shared more great technology that allows you to upload photographs from photo albums to computers and devices that will allow all of the photographs to be viewed and stored on a television. Let me mention that photographs can be viewed simultaneously by family and friends in different states; now is that high tech or what!

A photo was snapped of Senior Pastor Reed with a cell phone as he entered the Fellowship Hall and not even a minute later his photograph was uploaded and being viewed by all on a television. By the time the day ended, who would have thought that anyone that attended the conference ever had a fear of technology.


Friday evening's session was Leadership Night, with the focus, "Effective Leadership in the 21st Century: Leading a Tech-Savvy Generation." The 6th Annual Conference was officially opened by Ministry Director Maeleatha Sister Patterson gave a Patterson. brief review of the journey from the first Conference in 2008 up to this point and how God has tremendously blessed the efforts of the past five years.

Conference Chair and Assistant Ministry Director Jamar Patterson, was presented. He gave an overview of the Conference and took charge of the remainder of the Conference.

"The Relevancy of Evangelism in a Tech-Saturated Society" was presented by Evangelism Minister Cleo McGlory, making it clear our responsibility in the area of evangelism. Confronting the Fear of Technology.

The Luncheon Speaker, Rev.

Kelly Booker of New Union Baptist Church, closed the Conference with his emphatic, resounding and compelling message on the need to "Rebrand



the Church" if we are to be competitive and effective in this 21st Century.

# How to Walk on Water

[A Recap of Message of Black History Director, Erick Harris, By Linette Burton—Staff Writer]

What a blessed event in the celebration of Black History Month. Thank God for Deacon Erick Harris. The topic was "How to Walk on Water," Matthew 14:22-35. His question to us was: Have you ever felt someone didn't want you to accomplish your goal? We get really anxious and we don't know what is going to happen next, so it requires you to walk on the water.

Trusting in the Lord is most important. Deacon Harris reminded us of the miracles Jesus had done. One was how he fed over 5,000 men, women, and children with two fish and five loaves of bread.

Another miracle was when He told the disciples to get in the boat, and then the storm came. Why would He allow the boat to rock, and seem as if it would turn over. Deacon Harris mentioned how "he wanted to share his three points and then back out."

1. Just because we are believers of Christ doesn't mean we won't have to experience trials.

Things will not always go our way. The disciples were in the storm, which was pushing them in the opposite direction of their intended destination. Sometimes this may seem like a never ending battle.

2. Requires you to look at what's on the boat.

Jesus went to the disciples walking on the sea; they thought it was a ghost. Peter said, "Lord if this is you, please bid me to come to you." It's OK to be the only one to follow Christ.

Don't let stuff on the boat throw you off. You will see there will be some individuals telling you to follow them in their bad behavior. Mad at you, jealous because you excel, or have a good car. We all have things in life that will keep us from

following Christ. "Might be a hole in the wall club. One way in and one way out." Remember to take a personal inventory check.

#### 3. Get out of the boat.

Jesus did allow Peter to walk on the water, which lets us know some things we see as impossible is possible with God. This is where we must come out of our comfort zone. Peter was a good example. He believed the Lord covered him, so he started walking on the water. But when he doubted God, he started sinking.

Even when the wind is blowing against us and others are pushing against you, don't ever give up on God!
