### Passages

Each month in the "Christian Standard" magazine, which by the way (shameless plug) I highly suggest reading, one of the magazine's featured columns, is one called, "Passages." In this column, the magazine usually features long time Christian servants who have passed on from this life on earth or Christian servants who have passed on to a new earthly ministry assignment. So, recently, I was a bit caught off guard, when I saw a different kind of "passage" highlighted in the May 2016 issue. The column featured this "passage": "After 85 years, the Southwood Church of Christ, Columbus, OH, has closed its doors. The congregation's last worship service was Feb. 7."

I'm not sure why this announcement caught be off guard, except that the Christian Standard does not usually post announcements like this in their print magazine. I certainly wasn't unaware of this sad and all too often reality, as I have shared with you on more than one occasion the very difficult position that the American Church now finds itself in and the drastic measures that must be taken in order to reverse the trend. I have often read and shared stories and statistics regarding the fact, that depending on exactly which sources of information are used, somewhere between **4,000 and 7,000 churches close their doors permanently every year**. Each year more and more people are joining the ranks of the "nones," that is those who are religiously unaffiliated, meaning they do not attend church services with any regularity. And sadly, over half of the churches in the U.S. have not added a single new member in the past year, only increasing the chances that they will some day, perhaps sooner than they might think, join the long list of the thousands of churches that have forever closed their doors.

Perhaps, the reason that this "passage" caught my attention in a startling way, was because it reminded me of the sad reality that no church, to include WWCC is immune to the possibility. As I read of this sad news, affecting just one of the many churches, that have fallen victim, I couldn't help but think about why this church had finally made that agonizingly difficult decision. Columbus, OH is a very large city, so it certainly wasn't because there wasn't enough population to reach, but perhaps the church had consciously or unconsciously made a decision to not do what it takes to reach all those people, who undoubtedly are different than them and far from God. Had the church's members and leadership demanded that anyone new be welcomed only if they looked, acted and believed like them? Had the church refused to try new methods and new ways of doing church and committed to making the life of everyone who tried to introduce any change, as miserable as possible? Had the church become inwardly focused, instead of making an earnest attempt to become externally involved in their local community? Had their been a time in the history of the church, when it was thriving and when did the decline begin, ultimately leading to this "passage" story?

Obviously, I don't have answers to any of these or the many other questions that popped into my mind regarding this church in Ohio, however, this "passage" should make us all think about the future of the Church in America and specifically the church we all love, WWCC. So, the next time, you're tempted to complain about something that you don't like or are thinking about limiting your involvement because the leaders made a decision that isn't in accordance to what you wanted done or your thoughts are more in line with creating conflict and division, rather than unity, remember what could happen to our church. WWCC is a great church, with a great history, but it could become one of the thousands of churches, that have become a statistic.
