

Unleashing Compassion Through Missions

Recently for our annual Mission Sunday, we were blessed by an excellent message on compassion, by Dr. David Ray of Cincinnati Christian University. It was, I believe a very appropriate and Holy Spirit led message for us at WWCC, as we strive to be a church that is unleashing compassion locally and globally. Dr. Ray taught that having compassion is about first really seeing the people and the needs that are all around us and then choosing to do something to help meet those needs and make a difference in the lives of those people. In an interactive exercise, Ray asked us to give the opposite of several words and concluded by asking for the opposite of "love," to which most answered "hate." He then pointed out that perhaps the opposite of "love" is not "hate," but rather apathy or indifference. In other words, his point was, that compassion is not really compassion, until we do something.

There are a variety of ways that we at WWCC are striving to unleash compassion and point people to Jesus, however a primary way is through our Faith Promise Missions Offerings. Through your Faith Promise giving, we as WWCC help to support a variety of mission organizations and missionaries (for a complete list see one of the bulletin boards in the foyer and fellowship hall or speak with one of our missions committee members). These mission partners are doing great work sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ and preparing others to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ, but their work can only continue with the support of individuals and churches like us.

On this year's Missions Sunday, many of you made a Faith Promise Commitment for 2018 and those commitments so far total \$20,580.00. This puts us a little behind where we usually are after the first Sunday of commitments, and short of where we need to be to continue our current level of giving to all of our mission partners. If you have yet to make a Faith Promise Mission Commitment for 2018, it's not to late. What's Your Story?

Recently in the Middle/High School Sunday school class, we finished a series on writing and telling our stories. The reason that we started this series is because one of the kids said they didn't really know how to write or tell people their testimony. So the idea popped in my head about doing a series to help them with this. At the end of the series I had them stand up and practice their story in front of the class, so if they would ever need to tell someone else they might be able to do it.

I think we could all use this kind of reminder to get us thinking about what our story is, and how we have been changed by Christ in our lives. I am sure there are many of you that have a "boring" story, because you grew up in the church and were there whenever the doors were open. I am one of those people, so my story isn't as "cool" as someone who lived the good life before becoming a Christian. But we need to remember that we all have different stories, because we are all different people. Like I told the kids, if we all had the same story we wouldn't be effective in reaching others because they wouldn't want to listen, because it would be the same story that they may have heard 5 other times.

The Bible is full of really cool conversion stories about how people came to know who Jesus is and what they did with their lives after becoming a follower of Jesus. One of my favorite stories from the Bible is how Paul was converted on the road to Damascus. This story is found in Acts 9. He was walking there so that he could take Christians back to Jerusalem, so they could be put on trial and ultimately be put to death. But Jesus stopped him with a blinding light and asked him why he was persecuting Him. So Paul was blinded by this light for 3 days and didn't eat or drink for those three days, and all he did was pray. Then God told a man named Ananias to go to Paul, so that he wouldn't be blind anymore. Ananias was hesitant at first because of who Paul was, but he went and healed Paul of his blindness, and immediately he was baptized and ate food. Notice though, that the Bible says that Paul was baptized first and then he ate food.

This just goes to show that following Jesus should always be the number one thing in our lives and everything else comes second. I hope that this gets you thinking about what your story is, and I hope that you are willing to share your story with other people who don't know who Jesus is!


