

Uncommon Devotion

As a church, we recently concluded a seven week teaching series on the subject of Heaven, with each message focused on the general theme that we find in Colossians 3:1-2, "Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, **set your hearts on things above**, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. **Set your minds on things above**, not on earthly things." (If you missed any of those messages, you can watch or listen to them at westwaynesboro.com) The Bible instructs us to think about Heaven and what awaits us on the other side of this life, often, but with this preoccupation also comes serious responsibility. Each one of us has a mission, inspired by the Great Commission of Jesus Christ, to spread the Good News of the Gospel and share the amazing grace of God. With this as the back drop, we concluded our Heaven series, focused on the idea that the reason God wants us thinking about Heaven, is because it will affect the lives we live, decisions we make and will determine the things in which we invest.

As we looked at the example of the first followers of Christ, as recorded in the historical Biblical book of Acts, in that series concluding message, we were reminded that to do this effectively requires an <u>uncommon devotion and a contagious faith</u>. I shared during that message, that I am personally so thankful for each and every one of you that is living your life and living out your faith with an uncommon devotion. While we are in no way a perfect church, make no mistake about it, there are things happening at WWCC that are positively uncommon. In 2017, we have gotten to celebrate 10 baptisms!! In a culture where many churches are dying and have even closed, for a church of our size or even larger in some cases, to have celebrated 10 baptisms in one year is uncommon. These 10 baptisms represent God's Spirit moving in hearts and minds; challenging, encouraging, convicting and equipping. I also shared that your uncommon devotion has resulted in \$32,480 being committed in support of our mission partners for 2018, an increase of nearly \$8,000 over what was committed for 2017! (For a complete list of the missions/missionaries we support through these offerings, please visit our website or the bulletin boards located in the foyer and fellowship hall)

Collectively and individually we are also making an eternal difference and touching earth with a piece of Heaven in many other ways as well. This summer, in support of our mission partner Camp Rudolph, we were one of ten churches that collected food and other supplies to be used during the 2017 camp season. Your generosity resulted in saving the ministry budget of Camp Rudolph over \$2,000. As a church we supported the life affirming and defending ministry of Comfort Care Women's Health and 28 walkers (the most we've ever had) raised \$1,435 for this ministry. Through your Faith Promise missions giving, another one of our mission partners, Waypoint Church Partners, has been able to plant 6 new churches in Virginia and North Carolina in 2017, not to mention the 7 new churches that became 14, that were planted throughout the world in conjunction with the 2015 International Conference On Missions (ICOM)! In November, we packed 67 Operation Christmas Child Shoebox gifts and all together, the Shenandoah Valley region sent 22,625 shoeboxes, an increase of 11.45% over last year. And this December, our Helping Hands Food Pantry will be distributing Christmas food baskets to needy people in our own community.

I could go on and on about the many ways that your uncommon devotion is making a difference locally and globally, and how your contagious faith can and will grow the Kingdom of God, but for now I'll just say thank you! May each of us conclude this year and enter a new one, with a renewed sense of purpose, to live with an uncommon devotion, allowing our contagious faith to leave a heavenly imprint on a world where the imprint of sin is more than obvious. On behalf of my family and I, Merry Christmas!
