I am so thankful for people and churches that have a heart for life and a desire to do something to defend life and minister to those who are contemplating ending life or have regrettably made a decision to end life. Recently, as a church, we filled 61 baby bottles as part of the Comfort Care Women's Health annual Baby Bottle Drive. Those 61 baby bottles totaled \$940.42 and contributed to a total of over \$46,000 for the ministry of Comfort Care. As I write this, we are less than two weeks away from the annual Stride Walk, another one of the major fundraisers that supports the ministry of Comfort Care. A big thank you to all who have committed to take part in this walk, whether physically walking or walking in spirit. Please, remember to either register online @ supportcc.org or by using a paper registration form (available at the Information Counter/Mickey Center). Even if you don't have any pledges or just one pledge, (the WWCC Missions Committee is sponsoring the first 20 walkers with a \$10 pledge), please fill out a paper form, so that the WWCC impact on our community is properly documented. You can give your registration forms to Chad, Stephanie or directly to a Comfort Care representative.

Please, know that your participation and support is vitally needed and 84 cents of every dollar that is given goes directly to patient services, providing women and men a safe place to process pregnancy decisions and lifesaving services. Below you will find some of the history of the abortion and pro-life movements, thanks to research done by our ministry friends at Comfort Care.

- 1916 Margaret Sanger opens first birth control clinic in America in New York City. Margaret Sanger was a leading advocate of the eugenics movement, which promoted the reduction of sexual reproduction and sterilization of people with undesired traits or economic conditions.
- 1923 Sanger founded the American Birth Control League.
- 1942 The American Birth Control League became Planned Parenthood, promoting abortion as a safe way to end a pregnancy.
- 1973 U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion within the first 3 months of pregnancy in all 50 states. (Roe vs. Wade) Over 7 million babies have been killed by Planned Parenthood since abortion was legalized.
- 1968 First pregnancy help center in the U.S. opened in Los Angeles.
- 1983 Comfort Care Women's Health began as The Pregnancy Help Center.

As of 2013, there were approximately 2,500 Crisis Pregnancy Help Centers in the U.S. as compared with 1,800 abortion clinics.

56 million abortions occur annually around the world. About 1 million abortions occur annually in the U.S. Nearly 19,000 abortions occur annually in Virginia. About 1 abortion out of 9 births occur in the geographic areas Comfort Care serves. The ministry of Comfort Care is very much needed and your support is critical. Thank you for your support!
