12 Mistakes Dead Churches Make

Last month, I shared with you in this space the highlights of what I shared at our annual congregational meeting. Namely what it takes to move from being a good church, to being a great church. I shared at that meeting and in that article, that it will take continued community involvement (each of us actively choosing to be the church), an acknowledge of where we are currently as a church (a declining church) and an acceptance of change. This month I share with you a very relevant, insightful and true article that I read recently, "12 Mistakes Dead Churches Make," by Barry Cameron.

Dead churches erroneously believe...

- 1. Growth just happens. They mistakenly believe growing churches are nothing more than the result of being in the right place at the right time.
- 2. You can have evangelism without evangelists. In other words, you can reach the lost without ever having anyone actually reach out to the lost.
- 3. You can have progress without change. They want to to grow. They really do. They just don't want change.
- 4. You can have success without sacrifice. They've convinced themselves great things can come without any price being paid or pain being experienced.
- 5. God will bless in spite of sin and unholy living. They believe God will bless in spite of how they live.
- 6. First-class facilities, grounds, printed materials, programs and activities aren't important. The fact is, people who demand excellence in the cars they drive, homes they live in, and places where they do business, won't accept less than the best from the church they attend.
- 7. Leaders don't have to be tithers. Most people would be shocked to learn how many leaders don't tithe in dying churches.
- 8. By-laws, budgets and board meetings are really important. Growing churches focus, instead on the Bible.
- 9. The Pastor and staff work for us. The Bible teaches that the Pastor and staff are to equip the saints "for the work of the ministry."
- 10. Being traditional is spiritual. They forget the time-tested traditions of today were cutting edge "new" things of the "good 'ole days."
- 11. The world cares about our doctrine. We ought to have right doctrine for sure. However, just having right doctrine alone won't grow a church.
- 12. There's always next year. They have no sense of urgency. Growing churches pursue ministry every day, as if they don't have the promise of tomorrow. Because they don't.

Neither do we.

The CIY trip was an awesome experience this year for our high school students. They had many opportunities to hear how God was working in their lives and they also had the chance to hear how God wants to continue His story through each of us. One part of CIY that stood out for many of the students was CIY's mission for this year. They have partnered with CAFO (Christian Alliance for Orphans) to start a renewed focus on foster care and adoption in the church. They told us that there are roughly 400,000 children in the foster care system during any given time. Coincidentally, there are about 400,000 churches in the United States. Their point was that if just one family from each church were to choose to foster children, or even support people that choose to foster, the Church could help to virtually eliminate the staggering need orphaned children have for a home. What better home to go to than a God-loving, Christian home at that!

During the conference, the students heard from other students that had been brought out of the foster care system, or that had siblings from foster care. The stories were both heart-breaking and heart-warming to hear some of the challenges and the victories each person had experienced. One particularly tough morning, the students watched a film produced by CIY about a true story of a brother and sister, called "Hard to Place." The film showed just what type of life some of these children had escaped from or endure right here in the US. It ended with a sound many kids are left hearing, the ringing of a telephone, while they wait to find a home to be placed in.

As Christians, we are called to care for the orphaned and widowed. A lot of times, Christians are criticized for caring more about Pro-Life causes while we have situations like our overcrowded foster system being ignored. If we are for love and for life of the unborn, then we need to also be for love and for life of the born. As a church, we should be willing to consider making the commitment to become foster parents, but primarily we should seek out ways to support foster families and care for kids still looking for their placement. In reality, not everyone is meant to be a foster parent. However that does not negate our duty as followers of Christ to do our part. I think CIY summed it up best by saying, "Not everyone should Foster, but everyone should Care"


