Study Continues...

After hitting "pause" in our Believe study, to celebrate Christmas, we are diving back in.

On January 3rd, we will be in Chapter 11, "Worship." This chapter begins the next section of our study which focuses on the 10 key practices, which allow the 10 key beliefs to move from our heads to our hearts.

Defending Life

As I write this we are in the midst of the hustle and bustle of the Christmas season and it's hard to believe, that we are about to enter a new year. That's right, 2015 is almost a memory and by the time you read this it will be, and the new year 2016 will be a fresh slate of sorts, filled with loads of opportunities to serve God, build His Kingdom and do better serving Jesus than we did last year. As we leave 2015 and enter 2016, allow me to say thank you to all of you have served faithfully and put the good of others and the well-being of the Lord's Church ahead of yourself and your own desires. As I have said before, the success of this mission Jesus has given us depends on each and everyone of us, because truly we are better together. Specifically, thanks to all of you, who chose to give life and hope to people in our community and around the world recently through Christmas gifts for children at the Grundy Mountain Mission School, Operation Christmas Child shoebox gifts, ringing the bell for the Salvation Army's Red Kettle Campaign and filling the sleigh in support of the WWCC Helping Hands Food Pantry.

Our mission as a church, no matter what year the calendar says it is, is one of defending life, all life, from those who have yet to be born, to those who are near the end of life on this earth and everyone in between. January 17th, 2016 is Sanctity of Human Life Sunday, which is a day set aside to raise awareness that EVERY LIFE is precious and deserves to be recognized. We have a responsibility to minister to and defend the lives of all people, especially those who do not have a voice of their own.

In our community, we have an incredible ministry called Comfort Care Women's Health, which ministers to women AND men AND the unborn on a regular basis. Since this organization began in 1983, almost 20,000 individuals have been served and just last year, through the support of people like you, almost 1,000 patient visits, 453 pregnancy tests and 307 ultrasounds were conducted. As a result of these ministry visits, 68 women who were vulnerable to abortion chose life for their children and 9 women chose to begin a relationship with Jesus Christ.

The ministry of Comfort Care is desperately needed in our community and worthy of our support, especially when you consider that the Virginia Department of Health reports that there were 361 abortions conducted in 2013 in our local planning district. In 2014, Charlottesville abortion clinics conducted almost 1,000 abortions and all Virginia clinics performed 20,187 abortions.

Ministries like Comfort Care not only partner with the church in shining the light of Jesus in a dark world and advocate for the life of the unborn, but they also provide much needed training for new parents and they minister to women who are dealing with the affects of having chosen to abort a child, through the ministry of HEART (Healing Emotions and Renewing the Heart) groups. They report that one out of three women in our country will have an abortion by the age of 45.

As we begin a new year, I encourage you to prayerfully consider how you could not only support this fantastic mission partner, but also what God is calling you to do to build His church and move it forward in a culture that requires some different methods in order to reach people with the hope and life changing message of Jesus Christ. What will you do?



Also, if you have any interest in helping out with our Habitat Mission in the late Spring or early Summer, please let me know as soon as you can. I need to know soon because I need to let them know who all would be willing to help out and to give them a firm date(s) that we would like to help. This is open to all ages from kindergarden all the way up to 100 years old. So if you have a heart for missions in the community, please let me know and keep a lookout for upcoming details in the year ahead.

The plan that we have for the upcoming mission trips is to start off local, then go somewhere in the state of Virginia, then go somewhere in the US and finally go somewhere in the world, probably overseas. This process is found in the Bible, first in the Great Commission where Jesus says, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations." We also find Jesus saying something similar in Acts 1:8 (ESV) which says, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Throughout the year and the years to come I would encourage each and everyone of you to say a prayer for the planning and the execution of these trips and that we as a church can show the light of Jesus in this dark world, because everyone needs to know who Jesus is and what He is about. And as a church, we can make that happen in our daily lives and helping out in the community.

Effective January 1, 2016, there will be a \$35.00 usage fee for private parties in the fellowship hall.




