### Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends in Christ at King of Glory,

"Is the Reformation over? And what if it is?" That is the intriguing title of an article I recently read. The author asks: "Should we now ask whether the Reformation has served its purpose and should graciously go out of business?"

This is the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Reformation. Of course, the Reformation didn't just start one day in October 500 years ago. No, winds of change were blowing through those times just like they're blowing through our time. Martin Luther, with the aid of new technology, the printing press, was put forward as the first person created by the media. His writings spread like wildfire.

Now, Luther wasn't out to lead a movement such as the Reformation. He simply wanted to reform some of the Church's practices by offering some important propositions for debate. Is God's forgiveness for sale? Absolutely not! Seeking to be clear, slogans like "Word Alone", "Faith alone" and "Grace alone" became prominent—at least for the reformers.

Luther found himself in a leadership position in the Reformation. As a result, he was kicked out of the Roman Catholic Church. But Luther and other reformers continued their work seeking to be faithful to God's Word. Not long after that the "Lutheran" church was born. In 1555 at the Peace of Augsburg, it became legal to be a Lutheran and have a Lutheran church.

Over all the years, one of the things that remains is that Lutherans seek to be a reforming movement within the Church Catholic (which means "universal"). Always reforming, always looking for ways to hear God's Word anew, always on the move.

So, what do you think? Is the Reformation over?

God bless you and keep you in His Grace!

### **Leadership Retreat**

This fall's Leadership Retreat will be held October 13-14. A retreat provides the Board of Directors time to work on and discuss matters of importance that can't be fully discussed during a regular Board meeting. It's a different sort of time—a time of fellowship, team building, honest discussion, and decision making.

This year's retreat continues our conversations about the plateau zone King of Glory is in. Last year, since KOG is growing, we looked at the issue of making the transition to a "large" congregation. (That's one where average worship

attendance is 350 and up. Presently we are about 275 or so.) We took some initial steps to move forward and explore what that would look like.

Do we need to change our organizational structure? What changes to our church staff would we need to make? Is it time to update and revise our constitutional documents? How about using ministry teams?

### **Building a Budget**

Each fall the Board of Directors, with help and direction from the staff, builds a budget for the coming year. A budget is much more than just dollars and cents. It is the plan for what King of Glory hopes to accomplish in 2018.

The Board plans to host open forums on the budget next January so that members can ask questions, make comments, and offer suggestions. The Board will then propose a budget for the congregation to consider. The 2018 Budget will be adopted at the KOG Annual Meeting held in late January.



### Highlights from September Board of Directors Meeting...

The 2018 stewardship campaign runs the month of October. Worship and sermons are planned on stewardship and generosity. Pledge cards for 2018 may be turned in at any time. We're hoping for a generous response.

The preliminary budget for 2018 was presented. Questions we pondered were: 1) Should we officially become a "first fruits" congregation? That is where each month we give first to our benevolences and live off the balance. (That's what we hope our members will do!) 2) Should we officially designate 10% of our income toward our benevolences? 3) How do we meet the financial challenges of a growing church?

Our Constitutional update and revision was discussed. Questions we need to answer are: 1) Should we reduce the number of members on the Board of Directors? The present recommendation is to reduce it from 17 to 7. 2) Should all KOG pastors have voice and vote at the Board meetings or just the Lead Pastor? The present recommendation is that only the Lead Pastor has voice and vote. Our Associate pastors would have voice, but not vote. 3) Should we move away from our present organizational structure with board representatives to a smaller board and then use ministry teams to carry out the ministries of KOG? The present recommendation is to move toward ministry teams.

Our Leadership Retreat will be held October 13-14. We will be discussing these constitutional matters at the retreat.
