Sisters and Brothers of King of Glory,

A friend recently traveled out of state for a little rest and relaxation with her young family. Upon her return, she shared a recap of the trip and mentioned that one night they went to a restaurant for dinner. It had been somewhat of an ordeal to find an appropriate restaurant where both she and her husband could enjoy an upscale meal while at the same time their two-year-old could be fed and content. The restaurant they ended up choosing was called "Amy's Spaghetti House," as she surmised that pasta was about as kid-friendly as you could get. "So, how was the meal?" I asked. "The ceviche was fantastic," she raved. Then she paused. She continued by saying, "But the pasta sucked."

This exchange got me thinking about the expectations we have of one another as the church. In the same way one should expect excellent spaghetti from "Amy's Spaghetti House," what should people expect from King of Glory Lutheran Church? Or more generally, in today's changing world, what does our Church uniquely offer the Billings community or the world?

One of the distinctive marks of faith (both Christianity and Judaism) is the Biblical practice of Sabbath. Truth be told, I haven't been very good at it. The Bible asserts that God has instituted the Sabbath day as a day to: hear God's word, do no work, and trust that God's work continues even without my hands making-it-be-so. After nearly ten years as a Pastor of Word and Sacrament Ministry, Sabbath rest is a weak-link in my life.

That's one of the reasons I am grateful to the KOG Leadership for the gift of a three-month sabbatical that begins on Feb. 15. While academic sabbaticals often result in writing a book and clergy sabbaticals sometimes include a trip to the Holy Land, the expectation of my sabbatical time is concentrated on Sabbath. Through practices of reading, writing, prayer, exercise, connecting with family + friends, and creating intentional experiences with my spouse and children, I plan to practice the skill of stopping. In doing so, one of my prayers is that God would shift my focus from analyzing the past or dreaming about the future to *actually being present in the now*. And in doing so, I pray that



Sabbaticals for Pastor Jen and Ben Quanbeck

According to the current sabbatical policy of our congregation, leadership has granted Pastors Jen and Ben Quanbeck a three month sabbatical this mid-February through mid-May. During the time that they are away, Pastor Jen and Pastor Ben will not have contact with the congregation, other than on an emergency or incidental basis.

During the Quanbecks' absence, Pastor Darchuk will continue to serve King of Glory as Lead Pastor. Plans have been made for ways to cover pastoral duties during this time. Pastor Jim will do the bulk of the preaching and worship duties. The pastoral care team will assist Pastor Jim in caring for our congregation. If you feel a need to talk with a pastor, contact Pastor Jim. Educational and youth program areas will be covered by mentor teams. "Houston" fund raising activities will go on with help from the parents. Pastor Jim will teach confirmation after Easter and will lead the Holy Communion Milestone. Several people have told Pastor Jim that they are available to help if needed.

The congregation and staff of King of Glory Lutheran Church are asked to support and pray for the Quanbecks during their sabbaticals and for Pastor Darchuk during this time.



“Feast & Fellowship” for All Ages—Sign-Up by Feb. 21!

What is Feast & Fellowship? Feast & Fellowship is an opportunity for all ages to gather with others from our congregation to enjoy meals and fellowship together during March, April, and May. It is a great way to meet people for the first time or to spend time with those you already know.

How does Feast & Fellowship work? Interested individuals, couples, and families sign-up by February 21. Then each individual/couple/family is randomly assigned to 3 groups—one in March, one in April, and one in May. Each group will have about 8 people—more if the group includes families. Groups have a different host each month; people host only once; people can indicate on the sign-up sheet if they’d rather not be a host. The host decides on the meal—potluck or restaurant. If potluck is chosen, the host provides the main dish and asks guests to provide the bread/appetizer, salad, and dessert.

When do groups meet? Each group’s host helps his/her group decide on a meeting date and time for that month. The host can choose evenings, weekends, or even Sunday brunch. Choosing the meeting date and time can be done through phone calls, emails, or an online scheduling tool.

Where do groups meet? Meals can be held at the host’s home, the church (please check available dates through the office), or a place of the host’s choosing. A host could even choose a restaurant with all paying for their own meal. Restaurants such as Fuddruckers could be a choice for family groups.

Stewardship Campaign 2017 Results and Forward Momentum

This past year's (2017) Stewardship Campaign involved new ideas and approaches to encouraging our members to share their LIFE ABUNDANT. We designed a new brochure and pledge card explaining the importance of pledging, emailed our brochures to 75% of our households (others received theirs in the mail) and printed the brochures in-house which resulted in a significant cost savings. Pledge cards were included with the church bulletin for four weeks in October and members could make their pledge at any time including Pledge Sunday.

These efforts and more have resulted in an 11% increase in pledges received for 2018. As of 12/31/17, 114 households responded for a total pledged of \$401,155! This includes 17 new households making a pledge for the first time and 8 new households using our automated withdrawal system (this system is an easy and safe way to remember your pledge). Thirty-four households increased their pledge. For these commitments we give thanks to you, our brothers and sisters.

We invite others to join in this generous giving whether through pledges or offerings when you worship. These inspired gifts to our church reflect your understanding of the scriptures: what God has first given to us we are expected to return to him! Our generous giving encourages and supports our church's mission and vision of being good stewards to one another, our community and our world.

Efforts in the coming year will reflect a year-round emphasis on stewardship, encouraging our congregation to use their God given gifts within our congregation and beyond as we recognize our abilities to make a difference. We will also work towards developing a culture of high expectation for financial support. Towards this effort we hope to develop a brochure/handout explaining stewardship and suggesting guidelines for giving.

Thank you to our members and guests for your ongoing gifts. Together we do make a difference!


Having just celebrated our Golden Anniversary of 50 years at MSUB, we welcome Rev. Welch to carry us into our next 50 years!


