
IHN provides a case manager and other services that include:

CRITERIA FOR ACCEPTANCE BY IHN


- Drug and Alcohol Free

2008 IHN FUNCTIONAL EXPENSES




- 1. Program Expenses: goods and services distributed to fulfill the purpose of the organization.
