On last Sunday I blended two sermons together and worked with the theme:

I PLAN TO LIVE FOR JESUS IN 2014 HOW DO I DO IT?

I ended that sermon by declaring that in order to truly live for Jesus we need to learn **and** show

THREE TYPES OF LOVE RADICAL LOVE TOUGH LOVE POWERFUL LOVE

Radical Love – loving your enemies and unlovable people Tough Love – praying for those who misuse you Powerful Love – denying yourself in order to help others

I suggested that we could not love in the way Jesus would have us to love unless we did two things:

Do unto to others, as you would have them do to you and stay connected to your source of power Jesus the Christ.

I have two more sermons I wish to preach on **how we ought to live in light of the fact that we have a Saviour.** As I told you last week the theme for this morning is:

M. A. D. FOR JESUS
Making a Difference for Jesus

When I first began to consider this title I only thought about it being third Sunday and the Kingdom Seekers being in charge of the Music. I did not look at the liturgical calendar and realize this would be the second Sunday after Epiphany (Epiphany is the celebration of when the wise men came to see Jesus in some churches and in other churches it is the celebration of the Jesus' baptism. But Epiphany is also a word that describes a certain insight or revelation – it is when the light bulb goes on in our minds.) I did not consider the federal holiday calendar and realize that this is the Sunday before MLK Jr Day. Nor did I think about that within many churches this Sunday is also called Beloved Community Sunday. I was clearly focused on finding ways to bring home the point that living for Jesus may require some of us to make some changes in 2014. So I am amazed that the topic that I have had in my mind for the past two weeks fits with the religious calendar, the federal calendar and the African American Lectionary calendar.

I invite you to pray with me and for me as together we consider:

M. A. D. FOR JESUS Making a Difference for Jesus

SHALL WE PRAY! Bread of Heaven, Awesome Ruler, Jesus, Son of a Living God we come this morning asking that you allow us into your presence. We need to hear from you, we need to feel you moving in our hearts and our heads. We need to be transformed inside out and outside in until we can't stop ourselves from telling someone that you are the Living Word and you want to be in relationship with us. I ask that you move me out of the way and allow your Spirit to speak through me. Let something I say make someone M.A.D for Jesus. We ask this and more in the name of Jesus the Christ. AMEN and AMEN.

M. A. D. FOR JESUS Making a Difference for Jesus

Last week during Adult Bible Study we considered the question of what could we do to maintain the light of hope, the light of peace and the light of

______. We talked about how hard it is for one person without a public office or a lot of power to make a difference. I suggested that we continue to teach so that someone coming behind us might decide to get involved. Someone else suggested that prayer was the answer, God's people needed to pray for the changes they wished to see in the world. I believe that both answers are correct. Yet as I continued to think about the discussion I had an Epiphany.

We have each been charged with the responsibility to make a difference in the world. When we decided to follow Jesus, when we accepted

when we accepted that the Great Commission

¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you.

And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

was not just for disciples of the 1st century but for all disciples everywhere until Jesus returns we agreed to live our lives making a difference.

In the 2014 we stand on the shoulders of ordinary men and women who decided to make a difference. Gandhi and Mother Teresa in India, Mandela in South Africa, and of course Rosa Parks and MLK Jr in America. Ordinary people, who looked at the situations in which they were called to live and understood, that those situations of injustice were not what God had in mind. And they decided that they could do something about it.

That was my Epiphany! I might not, we might not, be able to start a movement but if we decide to get M.A.D for Jesus we can make a difference.

The parable of the Great Banquet that is included in our text this morning provides an opportunity for each of us to think about the invitation and the banquet in terms that make sense to us. We can think about it as any famous rich person we know preparing a meal and inviting us to attend.

But what if we think about it as an invitation to DWJD and live like we have a Saviour. Look again at the passage beginning with verse 16.

¹⁶ Jesus replied: "A certain man was preparing a great banquet and invited many guests. ¹⁷ At the time of the banquet he sent his servant to tell those who had been invited, 'Come, for everything is now ready.'

This is Jesus inviting us to follow HIM

This is us making an excuse for why we cannot come. my new house, new car, new opportunity

"Another said, 'I have just bought five yoke of oxen, and I'm on my way to try them out. Please excuse me."

This is us going to test drive our car, our new skateboard, our...

This is us on our social network, our social life, our social commitments
