Special Council Meeting July 13 at 7:45pm

Rick asked for a point of personal privilege. The president granted his request. He wanted to personally thank Jess and Shane Wagoner for all they did for VBS this past week.

Did you know that WELCA has paid for and had solar panels installed on the Phebe Hospital in Liberia? This means that 50% MORE physicians can be hired because of money saved AND the hospital can be functioning 24/7 because they are not dealing with electrical outages that are common in Africa. AND we have a new hospital that WELCA will support with solar panels.

At the Convention, 4 new officers and 17 executive board members were elected representing synods from all over the USA. Board members circulate to the SWO conventions in all synods yearly. Several resolutions were enacted; these cover: continued awareness of human trafficking and needs of refugees. Once the exact wording of these is in print, I will be sure to let you know.

Then, the Gathering began on Thursday! There were Bible studies based on the theme "All Anew," a speaker from Africa who won a Nobel Peace Prize, a variety of workshops, 2 documentaries to view, servant events, an exhibition hall, organ concerts, and other special services at a local Lutheran church along with the services that began and ended The Gathering. Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton preached at the opening service, and she had a meet & greet event. Can you imagine shaking hands with close to 3,000 women? I met a 6-year-old who was attending her 3rd Gathering- her first at 2 months. Honestly, there were too many things going on simultaneously to be able to do everything.

I went to workshops on: Homelessness, Spiritual Journaling, Multi-Cultural Awareness, and gifts of discipleship. I visited the exhibition hall gathering lots of information on the various "agencies" and places in which WELCA and/or the Lutheran church work – Phebe Hospital, LWR, LIRS, etc. I'll be making a LARGE binder of this information, which will be available at the end of August.

I attended 2 special church services: 1. Nordic Contemplative Prayer and 2. The National Lutheran Choir.

OK – I'll admit it the Nordic prayer was not really my cup of tea, but it was interesting. The Lutheran Choir, on the other hand, WOW!!!

Well, you all know that I use more words daily than the average, so....I could go on and on. Let's just say – once again, this event inspired me! It filled my spirit! I am so proud of the work that WELCA does both in the USA and the world!

The property committee wants to update the congregation on their status of repairs that they have complete and some upcoming projects. They began meeting monthly back in February to prioritize repairs and maintenance of our aging campus.

Accomplishments

- Lots of electrical work has been completed in Luther Hall
- Installed lights in the pantry and Kitchen
- Replaced leaking toilet in upstair boy's bathroom in Luther Hall
- · Repaired Refrigerator
- Serviced the stove in Luther Hall.

Major projects underway:

- · Air Condition in Luther Hall (main room).
- Updating Thermostats throughout both buildings.
- Council has contracted with Wayne Litton to begin work on the steeple beginning around the First of September. Permits are being obtained.

Upcoming (and much needed projects)

- Toilets will be replaced in Luther Hall with low flow models; this should give us a substantial savings on the water bill. This will involve a substantial initial investment to bring the plumbing up to modern standards but cost should be recouped in two to three years with the low flow models (that also won't leak)
- There are lots of little leaks around both buildings that need attention
- · Still plenty of electrical work needed for lights
- Rekeying locks on all church building doors and replacing keypad lock with a standard lock.





My brothers and sisters in Christ,

I think I should first update you all on my current mobility. At the end of June, my cast came off and I was put back into a boot. I was told I could walk but as long as the boot remained on my foot. After two weeks, I was cleared to begin physical

therapy and to walk on my foot as much as I could tolerate without the boot. I am on day three without the boot on my foot. I am amazed at how well my foot is doing. It is still a bit stiff and I will have to keep going to physical therapy, but I am much farther ahead than I originally thought I would be back on June 1. I walk like an 85 year old man and some days I feel like it, but every day I do feel better. Thank you for your prayers.

Did you see all the fun we had at VBS this past year? We had 65 children register and we fed over a 100 people each night, but I am not worried about the numbers. I am more excited about how much these kids grew in their faith. They heard God's love for them and how God created everything we see. They heard the gospel proclaim not only in word but in deed as well. We raised a lot food for a great organization, the Berkeley County Backpack Program. You know, sometimes we get really caught up in the numbers of everything when the reality is that we are called to be like the careless farmer who sows seed in the strangest of places (see Matthew 13:1-9) and even though we might not always get results, God promises the harvest will be plentiful. We have an awful business plan according to the world but according to the gospel, this is how God runs the kingdom. Thank you to everyone who helped during VBS. I will not name people because I am bound to forget someone but know each of you did a great job and the kingdom of God is better off because of your work.

I have been spending my weeks trying to get caught up with shut-ins and other members. I have taken advantage of being able to drive and have been putting a lot of miles on my Prius and Truck. If you know of anyone who needs to be visited, please drop me a note. I believe very strongly in visiting, especially to those who cannot make it to worship, so if I am missing someone, I really need to know!

l also want to thank our council members for the work that they have been doing over the past few months. If you remember back in February, the Stewardship committee held cottage meetings. From those meetings, the discussions and results were put together and were reported to Council. From that report, we have been working on creating goals. This past meeting, we finished the one year goals and you will see them hanging around church and they will be front and center on everything that we send out.

I ask you to pray over these goals and ask God to lead you in helping us make these goals a reality. These are what you have said we need to improve and now we ask you help us in making our congregation a more welcoming place, but we can't do this without you. I can't do what I do without you!

I hope you all enjoyed the Bluegrass Liturgy on July 30. As of right now, that has not happened and this newsletter is set to go out on July 31. Jerry and Ed have put in a lot of work to make the music sound great and holy to the ears of God and those who gathered this day.

There has been some talk about Sunday School and changing the nature in which it is used. I know some of you are worried about the future of it. When the Sunday School Movement was started, it was done for specific reasons, i.e. to teach those who did not have any religious instruction in school. It morphed into something much bigger over the years because the needs of the church and its people had changed. The church has been embarking on such a change again because the needs of the people have changed. We have a great group of people who are working at making sure our church meets the needs of our smallest disciples. Please pray for our Christian Education. I am confident that the Holy Spirit is going to lead us down the path we need to go. **Join us on August 1st to help us plan for the year**.

Finally, I had originally planned this back in June but with my leg messed up, I put this on hold. I have been wanting to do an alternative Evening Bible Study that met monthly over food and drinks. You probably have heard it called Pub Theology but since we are Lutherans, I like the title "Table Talks." In Luther's day, many of his students would join the good doctor at the local pub for drinks and theology. Many of those students recorded what was said and have those notes published in *Luther Works*. I like to do a similar style only nobody needs to record what I say. We will have conservation around a host of topics and my plan is start by asking the question, "What is the church?" Does this interest you? Do you like to eat and talk about theology, God or the church? Come on September 11 at 6pm to the Daily Grind and grab some food and share your thoughts.

In August, I plan to take a few days off to go to Ocean City, NJ with my wife and son. This is the first time he will be at the beach so plan to have your Facebook feeds overloaded with Thomas! May you all be well!
