A Letter from St. John's Council President

Dear Saint John's Congregation,

Since council did not meet in August, I wanted to give you some information about things that are in the works for our congregation, The Mustard Seed, and Sunday School. All of these items are possible because the council and board go into each meeting with a focus on our purpose, with a mentality such as that set by Jeremiah 29:11, "For I know the plans I have for you..." Knowing that we are simply the vessels that carry God's will, we listen to all of the thoughts and ideas that come from both in and outside of the council, board, or committees. Please know that as a group that works for the congregation and church, council meetings are open to all members of St. John's and all concerns are heard.

As most members are aware, cottage meetings were held recently to discuss our strengths, weaknesses, and opportunities. Using the information gathered, council has created a one-year plan. As of this moment, and after much deliberation, we felt that the following issues could be accomplished within one year:

- Addressing congregants' fear of coming to evening services and events by creating a shepherding program, improving signage and décor, increasing lighting, and beginning to use parking ushers
- Creating more frequent social events at least once per month
- Increasing FLYTE's interaction with the congregation, including better communication and more involvement in the services, such as children ushering once a month
- Developing a marketing plan to address low attendance and to draw new members

The Sunday School committee has also begun planning for this year's Sunday School classes. Bible lessons have been chosen for the entire Sunday School season and some new ideas are being implemented, including family projects and an adult classes. Anyone who has ideas or would like to volunteer is welcome to come to any meetings of the Christian Education committee. The schedule has been posted to our website at www.stjohnsmartinsburg.org.

The Mustard Seed families have been invited to rally day this year and the board is working on a discount plan for St. John's members. Not only do we want to include the Mustard Seed in St. John's family, but these are also methods that could help increase our number of active attendees/members. The Mustard Seed board has been meeting every month and is working to update processes and procedures to ensure that the Mustard Seed is reaching its optimal potential for both the center and the church. If you have a chance to go to The Mustard Seed during the day and observe everything in full swing, you will find that excellent work is being done there and the Mustard Seed students are being filled with God's love and the Gospel.

With our growth, I expect that there will be growing pains. We - as a council, as a board, and as individual committees - are confident that our congregation will rise to meet any challenge and will come out stronger on the other side. As we grow and changes come about, I implore you to keep in mind Luke 11:17 – "But he, knowing their thoughts, said to them, 'Every kingdom divided against itself is laid waste, and a divided household falls."" Let us remain a united front, for within our differences, our uniqueness, and our various experiences lies the diversity needed to overcome any obstacle that might come our way.



The Committee Meeting Night will be on the first Tuesday of each month at 6pm.


