

#### A Few Ways for Families to Celebrate Thanksgiving

Maybe you have started your list already: turkey, stuffing, potatoes, green bean casserole, pumpkin pie. The family dinner is taking shape. Don't forget to add another important item to your list: tradition. Even if your kids are getting older, now is a great time to start some new family traditions that will make your Thanksgiving celebration more memorable and meaningful.

- 1 Tablecloth Tradition: Buy a large tablecloth that you can use every year. Purchase some fabric pens and have your family members write specific things for which they are thankful. (Be sure to include the date!) As you do this for several years, you will be creating a host of memories to look back on each year. Remembering God's blessings from the past can help us be more hopeful for the future.
- **2 Family Timeline:** The first idea will take several years to complete, but you can start remembering right now by making a list or timeline of the events in your family's life. Include those times when you have seen God working and when your faith has grown.
- 3 Thank You Notes: We often write notes to friends and neighbors who give us presents or do things for us, but how often do we make a written acknowledgment of the everyday things that happen in our own families. "Mom, thank you for making such a great dinner! I love it when you make strawberry salad." "Dad, thanks for fixing my tire last week. Riding my bike is so fun!" "Danny, thanks for helping me rake leaves on Saturday. I enjoyed our time together."
- 4 Remember the "Invisibles": Sometimes we also take for granted all the people who do things for us on a regular basis. As you are in the note-writing mode, consider writing thank you notes to everyday people like the paperboy, the garbage men, the lunch ladies at school, the cab driver, and the waitress.
- **5 Guess Who Game**: I n the days leading up to Thanksgiving have each member of the family complete this sentence several times: "I am thankful for\_\_\_\_\_." Put each sentence on a small slip of paper and mix them up in a large bowl. On Thanksgiving Day, pull out the slips one at a time and try to guess who authored each slip.
- 6 Invite: Thanksgiving is traditionally a very family-centered holiday, but what about those who don't have family close by? Consider expanding your table by inviting some people who might not have anywhere to go like a college student, a shut-in, a single mother and her children, a widower, or a new family in your church.
- 7 **Write Prayers:** To help your family stay focused on giving thanks to God, have each member of the family write a prayer to share throughout the day. You can give each person a different theme or idea to start with or let them create their own prayers. With each prayer time, you might include a short Bible reading.



Pastor Day's Mileage for the month of September was 645 miles.



My brothers and sisters in Christ, For all the saints, who from their labors rest...

The month of November begins with the celebration of All Saints Sunday. A festival in the church where we remember our beloved brothers and

sisters who now enjoy the full feast of resurrection. Lutherans traditionally do not have good language to talk about the saints. We often say that we do not pray to saints, we pray to God alone, but yet we confess in our creed that we believe in the communion of saints. Suffusive to say, saint language.

So let's talk about some saintly language. First off, All Saints Sunday is a time when we remember those who have deeply impacted our faith but who are no longer with us. When St. Paul writes about death in his letters, he tells us that death is like sleeping. When I was in seminary, we asked Dr. Carlson to explain this. He said, "Remember when you were younger and you went to Hershey Park for the day? You would play all day long and be exhausted by the time you get to the car. On the way home, you would fall asleep and be so tired that you would not even remember your dad carrying you in to your bed. However, when you wake up the next morning, you find yourself in your own bed, though you do not remember the trip inside. And once you put your slippers on, you come down stairs to find that your dad made you pancakes. That is what Paul means."

All Saints Day can be a very hard time for many in our congregation. Remembering the death of a loved one can still bring up hard emotions but that is why we believe in the communion of saints. When we speak of the saints, we are not only referring to those who have died but those still present, in our community of faith. This is why on November 5th, we will not only remember those who are no longer with us, but we will welcome those "new saints" who want to join our congregation as members in the body of Christ.

So, are you thinking of joining our congregation? There is still time to do so. Just let me know. For many people in my generation, membership is a real foreign concept. We don't like joining groups that we do not know anything about. I often think that the church

should change our language from membership to discipleship. Membership in the church means you promise to make a commitment to pray for the congregation; to participate in the worship life of the congregation; to grow in your faith; and support the church through your time, talents and treasures. Joining a congregation is bigger than just membership. Anyone can be a member of an organization, we want you to embody the church in all that you say and do. Maybe that is a bit more overwhelming than many want to hear, but imagine if we all thought of ourselves less as members of St. John's and more of disciples of Jesus who are strengthened spiritually at St. John's.

As we have been talking over the past few months, the gospel of Matthew has high expectations for disciples. I think we should have high expectations of one another as well, but instead of doing what the world does when we make a mistake, we offer forgiveness. I think about all those blessed saints in my life who pushed me to be a better person, son, Christian, and eventually pastor. I think of those professors who made my life miserable, but in challenging me, made me a better person. I think of my scout master who was tough on me but in being tough, made me a stronger person. I think of my speech pathologist who never gave up on me; who worked week after week with me to help me in speaking more clearly. If it wasn't for her, I would not be a pastor. I think of my grandparents who made sure I went to church, knew about Jesus, and made sure I knew the love of my family. But I know these people were not perfect, but honestly, it doesn't matter.

If we learn to hold each other to high expectations as well as forgive when mistakes are made, we will get stronger. Gossiping doesn't make us stronger. Judging others does not make us stronger. As Jesus reminded us a few weeks ago in the gospel, we are not just hypocrites but we are forgiven hypocrites. Whenever I read about the saints, we hear so many stories of the great things they have done, as well as the mistakes they have made, but yet they are still saints because the church found a way to forgive them. We are a great church when we do the same to each other.
