Besides food, we also write financial vouchers. These vouchers are



My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Why are we bothering with Advent? The rest of the world does not have an Advent season. But we do bother with Advent. Advent is important because it prepares us for the coming of Christ, and not just the sweet, little baby in a

manger, Jesus. -Family Service at 6 pm. Don't worry about the kids making noise or running around - this is their service so bring the whole family!


