# **Church Committees**

At the March Council Meeting, the church council took up the subject of committees. We processed the comments and ideas brought up at the town hall meeting in February and came up with the following ideas:

- 1. Move committee meetings from weeknights to Sundays after worship.
- 2. Have as many committees as possible meet on a Fifth Sunday. It was suggested that committees not meet monthly but quarterly. However, there are some committees have more work to do than others and should meet more often. Next fifth Sunday is April 29th. Mark your calendars and be sure to stay after church. Find a ministry athat you are passionate about and participate. We need you voice, hands, and feet to carry out our mission of spreading the good news.
- 3. Committee meetings can be formal or infomal. Some of the best committee meetings happen during the coffee hour after worship on Sunday. Just make sure that Pastor Matt knows you are meeting so that it can be advertised in the bulletin to the whole congregation. We need to raise up new leaders and make sure everyone has the opportunity to participate.
- 4. Agendas for all committee meetings will be posted on our website and in the narthex of the church. Please send your digital copy of the agenda to the church office email.
- 5. On the first Sunday of the month, we will have doughnuts and other baked goods after worship during the coffee hour. We are asking that a committee take a Sunday to make some cookies or pick up some doughnuts. **Keep it simple!** We will take care of the coffee, you will only have to bring about three dozen of cookies or doughnuts.



### **APRIL 2018**

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Greetings in the name of of the crucified and risen Christ! As the women approach the tomb, they see a man sitting at the place where they laid Jesus' body and he says to them "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised..."

However, in Mark's gospel, they are very alarmed and they run away. I really cannot blame them for being afraid at the Angel's proclamation. For when Jesus was arrested, convicted and put to death, none of his followers remained. They all ran in fear of their lives. What if Jesus was going to take some revenge on his followers? What if he was angry?

But notice what the angel says to the women at the tomb -Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised... The emphasis in the text is not that Jesus was raised from the dead, but that Jesus was crucified. And why is that important?

Because it means all the suffering, all the shame, all the pain that Jesus experienced through his trial and death, it was worth it in the end. The cross meant that our God knew what it was like to die. Our God could now relate to us, relate to you, in a way that never possible before. And because of the death brought by the cross, we could also see that our God has the power of resurrection. And this is not just any kind of resurrection, but a resurrection that will stick for all of eternity. It is a death and resurrection that we all share in together because of our baptism.

We are all active participants the Paschal mystery of our Lord. "During his earthly life Jesus announced his Paschal mystery by his teaching and anticipated it by his actions. When his Hour comes, he lives out the unique event of history which does not pass away: Jesus dies, is buried, rises from the dead, and is seated at the

right hand of the Father "once for all" (Rom 6:10; Heb 7:27; 9:12; cf. In 13:1; 17:1.) His Paschal mystery is a real event that occurred in our history, but it is unique: all other historical events happen once, and then they pass away, swallowed up in the past. The Paschal mystery of Christ, by contrast, cannot remain only in the past, because by his death he destroyed death, and all that Christ is - all that he did and suffered for all of humanity - participates in the divine eternity, and so transcends all times while being made present in them all. The event of the Cross and Resurrection abides and draws everything toward life. Christian liturgy not only recalls the events that saved us but actualizes them, makes them present. The Paschal mystery of Christ is celebrated, not repeated. It is the celebrations that are repeated, and in each celebration there is an outpouring of the Holy Spirit that makes the unique mystery present" (Taken from http://www.vatican.va/archive/ccc\_css/ archive/catechism/p2s1c1a1.htm#1085).

The season of Easter is a total of 50 days long. Continue to participate in the story that saved the world. What does it mean to have our savior resurrected? What does this mean for us? What does this mean for the world? So much changed on this day 2000 years ago. This event in the past does not remain there. The world needs to know that because Jesus lives, life will never be the same. I look forward to seeing your on April 1st and every Sunday afterwards. Reminder, we worship as one congregation at 10am starting April 8th. Be sure to stay after church for some coffee and doughnuts.
