# 2018 COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

September 18, 2018

Meeting called to order by: President Mindi Esswein

**Members present:** Mindi Esswein, Pastor Matt, Darrell Propst, Shane Wagoner, Blaine Wilson, Mike Noll, Anne Moore, Linda Payne, Diane Shewbridge, Jerry Crites, Jane Kelley, Bess Day (Treasurer) Members Absent: Ray Bentz, Austin Propst

**Devotions:** Pastor Matt led a discussion on the first two chapters of Leading Beyond the Walls. Council members are to answer the 3 questions for our October meeting.

**Minutes:** July 2018 council meeting minutes and the minutes from the special meeting on August 26th to approve Sophie Plamer as Interim Choir Director were approved. (M/S/P: Pastor Matt Day:Linda Payne)

**Financial Report**: Financial reports were presented by Bess Day. Giving is on trend for expenses. Luther Hall water and electric bills continue to be lower over last year. The Mustard Seed is holding steady.

**Pastor's Report**: The following proposals by Pastor Day were addressed by council

- The parking/towing sign at the parking lot entrance will soon display a welcoming message.
- St. John's will schedule a Work Day with projects to be identified that need to be addressed in/around the church. Sunday, October 14<sup>th</sup> is scheduled for this event. Projects will be identified in advance so volunteers can sign on for one of the projects prior to the Work Day, and attend church service dressed for work. FLYTE members will be recruited to assist as well.
- Pastor indicated that our Christmas program will be different this year. Currently there are not enough children for a traditional Christmas program and our Choir Director, Heather, is on leave. Pastor has reviewed some programs that are meant to be presented with no advance rehearsals that would work well at St. Johns. Other ideas are welcome.
- A Bible Presentation Sunday is proposed. Members are encouraged to bring their Bibles from home for a blessing, and those without a bible of their own will be given a bible. Little or no expense is anticipated as there are some bibles in church already that have not been previously distributed.

#### **Upcoming Events:**

- Pet Blessing on Sunday, October 7<sup>th</sup> at 1pm in the parking lot area.
- Reformation Day liturgy and German Potluck on Sunday, October 28<sup>th</sup>.
- Trunk or Treat on October 28<sup>th</sup> following the German Potluck.

### • Upcoming Congregational Meetings:

-Budget presentation and approval on Sunday, November 4<sup>th</sup>. A goal is to more clearly explain any changes or cuts to the proposed budget. -Voting on new officers for the church will take place on Sunday, December 2<sup>nd</sup>.

#### **Points of Information**

A gift of \$350 in memorials was received. The families were in favor of purchasing Lectionary Books that have the Sunday's lessons printed and arranged in an easy-to-read format. These books are also very nice to use in processions as well. With the families' approval, the books have been ordered and will be dedicated when they arrive.
 -Covenants will be distributed on Sunday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>. Both paper and fillable online covenants will be available.

#### **New Business:**

- Luther Hall Request: A Luther Hall request for a baby shower by Stephanie, a Mustard Seed employee, conflicts with a Church activity (Holiday Bazaar). A motion was made to offer the Chapel in lieu of Luther Hall. (M/S/P: Mike Noll:Jerry Crites)
- Luther Hall Request by the Lion's Club Breakfast w/Santa on Saturday, December 8<sup>th</sup>, 9-11am. (M/S/P: Jerry Crites:Darrell Propst).
- Sound system proposal: an anonymous donation has allowed an expanded upgrade of the current old system. With this new proposal, some of the parts of the old system in the church can be repurposed for use in Luther Hall. The new proposal of \$19,350 by DSL Sound Inc. was approved by council. (M/S/P: Mike Noll:Jerry Crites)
- Air Conditioning Proposal has been rebid by Shenandoah Air Conditioning and Heating, Inc. with Griffith given the opportunity to rebid also. Council voted to accept and move forward with Shenandoah Air's proposal which was \$30,000 less than Griffith Oil/for same specs. A motion to rescind the prior motion to award the contract to Griffith Oil and sign a contract with Shenandoah Air. (No contract was signed with Griffith.) (M/S/P: Darrell Propst/Mike Noll)
- Lighting and Electrical Proposal: Trenary Service Company has submitted a proposal/quote for upgrading the Dimmer Panel and Lighting in the church. These improvements will address safety issues as well as use less electricity (LED fixtures). The current dimmer box (wooden) gets hot and is a fire hazard. The project quoted includes retrofitting lighter dimmer panels (10) with new style dimmers, retrofitting existing wooden cabinets with fans to reduce heat buildup, retrofit recess lights in sanctuary with LED lamps (10), install new LED lamps in existing hanging fixtures (4), install new LED flood lights in the chancel/pulpit area (2). The congregation will be presented with the proposal (\$5,926) for approval.
- FLYTE Room Issues: The carpet in the FLYTE room has mold

mildew issues. Getting an estimate for an AC/dehumidifier unit will be explored as well as steam cleaning the carpet to remedy the situation.

• Council Meeting Schedule: Holding council meetings on a different day than Monday was discussed. It was agreed that Council would continue to meet on the second Monday each month as the regular meeting time.

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

- Christian Education: The first Sunday on Monday evening program was a good group and went well. The plan is to try it for a year.
- Social Ministry: Friends Feeding Friends will provide meals to the community on September 22<sup>nd</sup>. Bess Day applied for an ELCA grant to fund FFF in the coming year. A Memorial Service at 11am followed by dinner in Memory of Beverly Zavash will be held on Saturday, September 29<sup>th</sup>. A blood drive sponsored by St. John's will be held the same day and has been relocated to the Fire Hall on the corner of N. Raleigh and W. Martin Streets, Martinsburg. Volunteers to help with both of these events would be appreciated. Movie night continues to be the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday each month. The October family night movie will be on October 13<sup>th</sup> due to the Apple Harvest activities on Saturday, Oct 20<sup>th</sup>.
- Evangelism: No Report
- Worship and Music: Sound System upgrade rebid.
- **FLYTE**: No report other than the FLYTE room issues.
- **Property/Tech:** Darrell Propst will ask Trenary for a quote on installing LED lighting for the parking lot and installing electrical outlets at the shed in the parking lot. This addresses the issue of safety after dark in the parking lot area. Darrell Propst will begin replacing lights in the hallways in Luther Hall as he is able. The steeple repair continues as weather permits. There is wet plaster in the elevator area and also the steps area to the choir loft. If possible, we need to contact the architect or the elevator installer to get to the source of the leak in order to address correcting it.
- **Mutual Ministry**: The committee met on August 28<sup>th</sup> over dinner for a good discussion. A concern was expressed that kneeling at the altar is hard for some members. Communion issues will be put on the agenda for Council's October meeting. The Panhandle Conference is going well and plan to meet soon.
- Stewardship: The Blood Mobile sponsored by the Stewardship Committee will be moved to the Fire Station on the corner of N. Raleigh and W. Martin Streets on Saturday, September 29<sup>th</sup> from 9:30 am to 2:00pm. The Covenants were developed and are ready for both paper and fillable online versions and will be distributed on Sunday, September 23, 2018. A day will be scheduled to clean up the flower beds at St. John's. Volunteers are needed.

With no other business, the meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer. (M/S/P:Jerry Crites:Linda Payne)

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

501 years ago, a German monk changed Christianity with a document famously called the 95 Theses. This document turned the whole church upside down and created a major division in the church. Since then,

Lutherans have remembered October 31st as the day when we broke our chains of tyranny by remembering how our founder ran the church in Wittenburg and nailed that document to the church doors. And we have been nailing each other ever since...

500 years is long enough to continue this separation. Much has been done to unite our two churches though there is still much to do. I think it is time we stop with the nailing and look towards the future. Instead of Reformation Sunday being that pep-rally of sorts, I want to make this particular Sunday to be more about the principles of the Reformation. This year in particular, I want to focus on the Word of God.

Pray that we have some nice weather but if we don't, we will move the Trunk or Treat inside. Also happening in October is Work Day and Fall Planting. There are a lot of projects that need to be taken care of around our church. The church is not a building, but we have been given this space to do ministry, vital and important work of the gospel. We need to be good stewards and maintain the space so that the work of the gospel can be done. Will you help us out?
