












2018 COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES September 18, 2018

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

We say these words every week when we confess our Christian faith. For many of us, we know them by heart, others may remember the old words once said. But what do these words mean?

Luther's explanation on the third article of the Apostles' Creed teaches us that we cannot come to faith on our own but that the Holy Spirit has come to us and influenced our faith.

I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy and kept me in the true faith, just as he calls, gathers, enlightens, and makes holy the whole Christian church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one common, true faith. Daily in this Christian church the Holy Spirit abundantly forgives all sins—mine and those of all believers. On the last day the Holy Spirit will raise me and all the dead and will give to me and all believers in Christ eternal life. This is most certainly true.

This is almost required memorization for Confirmation Students (I say "almost required" because I don't like to require students to memorize things since I lack that ability myself). This explanation teaches us that it is not about us but it is about God doing the work in our life and that at the end of our journey, God will raise us up as well as all believers in Christ to eternal life. St. Augustine once said that "Faith is to believe what you do not see; the reward of this faith is to see what you believe." We must wait in order to see the fulfillment of the final part of our Creed, but we and all the saints will see it fulfilled. It is why Luther concludes this and all three explanations by saying, "This is most certainly true."

When I hear this Third Article of the Creed, I believe that the Holy Spirit can move me in ways and give me a voice to speak God's message of love and mercy. I believe that God gave us a church where we can glimpse his coming dominion in the smell, sounds and tastes of worship. I believe in this great communion of saints - this gathering f those who have died who we miss having them near us. I believe that God can even forgive wretched sinner like me. And I believe that more to life than just the small snippet we experience on earth.

What do those words mean for you? Do you simply say this every week and never think about it? That's okay and we all do it, but I want you to try to engage these words over the next month. With the celebration of All Saints and a month of reading focused around life and death, please have discussions with your family about death and the hope you have for the life still to come. So often we hide death which is not very healthy. All of us will experience death and loss in this lifetime and hiding from it won't make it any easier. Have you ever told your spouse about your wishes for when you pass? I think this is important for couples of every age. A few years ago, I was having to deal with some health issues. After this experience, I decided to talk to my wife about what to do with my body after I am gone. One night, I even took the time to put together my own funeral bulletin (I know it sounds morbid, but it brought me a lot of comfort). Take time this month and talk with your family about death and be open about your wishes. Write a Will to make sure your family is well taken care of after you are gone. Bring me your thoughts and questions, as I would love to know where you all are at in your faith and beliefs about death. I know this is morbid and may not be something you wish to discuss, but ignoring death will not make it go away.

Our congregation has lost a number of people this past year. It members have joined the church triumphant since the last All Saints Sunday. Many of these men and women have been pillars in our church. There are many on the list whose death really affected me. I am forever grateful for this community of faith we have here because part of being a congregation means I did not have to go through this grief alone. None of us ever have to face losing a dear friend alone. We have each other and more importantly, we have the gospel that tell us that death's sting is gone.
