



Devotions: Pastor Matt led a discussion on chapters 3 and 4 of *Leading Beyond the Walls* as Council continues to read and discuss this book. **Minutes:** October 2018 meeting minutes approved. (M/S/P: Pastor Matt:Darrell Propst)

Financial Report: Financial reports were presented by Bess Day. Offering was up due to 5 Mondays in October. Deposits are made on Monday.

Pastor's Report: The church Work Day and Garden Day was very successful. In 3 hours 14 projects were completed. Only four projects were unable to be completed. There will be another Work Day scheduled in the spring. **Pastor had 4 proposals for council consideration.**

- Consider options for a program on the Sunday before Christmas: Mindi Esswein will consult with parents attending the Graham Cracker House event and suggest a children's song presentation for the Sunday before Christmas.
- Update on the Covenant results to be distributed to each Council member with plans going forward: Linda Payne reported that fifty-three covenants had been returned to date. Thirtyone members who returned covenants last year have not submitted a covenant as of today (11/12/18) but covenants can still be submitted. Covenant results will be discussed at the

next Council meeting.

- Christmas Day Service will be held at Trinity Episcopal Church this year.
- 12/30/18 (5th Sunday) church service will be the reading of the lessons and singing carols.

Unfinished Business: The discussion on Holy Communion is tabled until the December meeting.

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Why are we bothering with Advent? The rest of the world does not have an Advent season. But we do bother with Advent. Advent is important because it prepares us for the coming of Christ, and not just the sweet, little baby in a

manger, Jesus. We get so caught up in the idea of the sweet, little, baby Jesus in the feeding trough that we forget that Jesus was born, lived for about 33 years, died on a cross, and was resurrected. Advent is less about getting ready for Christmas and the sweet, little baby Jesus coming into the world as it is about us getting ready for Jesus coming into a world. That is why our lessons over the next four weeks are more about the end of time and the prophets preparing the way for Jesus. The birth narrative will come with all its splendor, but first we need to talk about what it means to have Jesus present in our world. I hope you take time this Advent Season to prepare, not so much for Christmas, but for Christ coming into your world and life.

With that said, we have a bunch of activities to help get you ready for all the above. Let's start with the Spiritual exercises first:

- -Advent Devotionals are going to be online this year. Pastor Matt and Pastor Diane are planning to do a short video each day. Just log onto our facebook page and click the video. We will try to have them up by 7 am each day.
- -**Participate in our Reverse Advent Calendar.** There is a flyer in our Newsletter explaining everything that you need to do. Check it out.
- -Come to worship. We have some great things planned each week that really work. Set aside some time this month and be with your church community.
- Now for the fun activities:
 - -St. Nicholas of Myra will be remembered on Sunday on December 10. We will have a special guest this day to teach our children and adults about St. Nicholas and why we remember him. Bring the kids and grandkids!
 - -No-Fuss Christmas Pageant to December 23 at 10 am. With the death of Linda and also with Heather taking a leave of absence,

we have had to get creative with the Christmas Pageant. Anyone (and I mean anyone) can participate in the Christmas pageant this year. We will need people to look and act the part of all the characters from the Christmas Story. There is no rehersal necessary, just come the day of pageant and be ready! We will have more information for parents and families at the Graham Cracker House making on December 2.

And then come and worship with us on Christmas Eve. We have two times for you to be with us:

-Family Service at 6 pm. Don't worry about the kids making noise or running around - this is their service so bring the whole family!

-Candle Light Service at 11pm. Our Choir is putting together a wonderful prelude so come early. Services times for both were changed this year to better accommodate everyone's wants and schedules.

-And on Christmas Day, we will gather back at 10:30 am for a much quieter Christmas Day service at Trinity Episcopal. This is my favorite of all the Christmas services. If you have never been able to attend, I highly suggest making the effort. What is special about this service is that it is the first ecumenical Christmas Day service. We plan on setting up a rotation and will have the Christmas Day liturgy at either our church, Trinity or First Presbyterian. We have worked with these two other congregations on Palm Sunday and we thought we try taking this relationship to the next level. Pastor Rufus will be preaching and Pastor Julie and I will preside.

A blessed Advent and Christmas to you all. We will be taking a month off for the newsletter so look for us in February 2018! We have another congregation meeting on February 3 that will include a town hall time where we hope you bring questions and concerns. The leadership here wants to make sure we are meeting your needs as well as pushing all of us to be better disciples of Jesus Christ. A blessed Advent and Christmas to you and your family!
