2019 ST. JOHN'S COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES April 8, 2019

Meeting called to order by: Rick Losh, President

Rick Losh, Council President, called the meeting to order Pastor Matt led devotions

Pat Murphy: Pat attended the meeting on behalf of a Boy Scout in Troop #13 wanting to clean the headstones in our cemetery as an Eagle Scout project. The scout did not keep his appointment to be present with Pat so the request was not entertained at this time.

Pat also asked for a notice to be placed in the newsletter asking for volunteers to help with trimming/weed whipping around the cemetery and headstones after mowing. Pat does the mowing about every other week, depending on the weather. If he had 3 or 4 volunteers to do trimming after he mows, it would only take about 45 minutes to get it all done. In addition to the trimming, other tasks will be announced for the spring clean-up day.

Minutes: March 2019 meeting minutes were approved. (M/S/P:Mike Noll; Drew Catrow)

Financials: Bess Day, Treasurer, presented the Financial Report for February. Property Insurance and Confirmation Retreat expenses at Caroline Furnace were paid out in February. Mustard Seed income is a little bit under but will go back up now that we are out of bad weather. Summer program is nearly fully enrolled already (22 of 25 slots)

Pastor's Report:

Pastor presented an A/C and Heating policy to establish reasonable temperatures for the various areas in the Church and Luther Hall. Being able to regulate the temperature in the various areas will cut energy costs while still providing a comfortable environment for worship, day care, working and learning.

The kitchen thermostat will be fitted with a lock box.

Pastor would like us to consider doing a new Picture Directory. This was discussed but no decision at this time. Bethel Church may have licensed medical personnel on had to administer Hepatitis shots on their meal night at St. Johns.

Old Business: Panhandle Printing has designed the logo to be used on the Welcome bags. We will soon be having the bags ready to give to potential new members/families. Spring clean-up day has been set for May 19th. Pastor and Property committee will draw up a list of projects. An inspection by DHHR cited peeling paint on and around

doors in need of correcting. Luther Hall will be painted on cleanup day and some ceiling tiles painted as well. Supplies for the painting project are to be solicited by donations from the congregation.

New Business: Seven youth will be Confirmed on June 9, 2019. Council sponsors will be assigned.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Christian Education: Shane reported that Vacation Bible School has the teachers lined up. A music director is still needed, but Austin Propst's friends may be able to do this again. Sunday on Monday is doing well and will continue through the end of May before taking the summer break. Pastor indicated that the Conference is going to hold "Safe Sanctuaries" training. This would be training for those working with youth and council members. A date will be set later.

Youth from our Conference are invited/encouraged to join in. On the 1st and 3rd Mondays each month the group will have a lesson. On the 2nd and 4th Mondays there will be a social activity. The group, which hopes to continue 12 months, expressed interest in attending musical events, volunteering with area non-profit projects and participating in other activities. The group which has 5 members is cleaning up and rearranging the youth room downstairs, repairing the pool table, and doing some painting with Council's approval. Pastor would like to locate a larger TV (48-50"?) as well as a projection screen and data projector for the LYFE room downstairs.



My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Every year, I practice reading the gospel of John's resurrection account. Every year, I think I can make it through without getting choked up. Every year, I fail. The account of Mary meeting Jesus in the garden is a

very personal account of the resurrection. The other gospels talk about how the resurrection affected the whole group, i.e. the church. John takes a different view and talks about how Jesus' resurrection affected one person, Mary.

This year's Holy Week and Easter worship services were particularly very meaningful to myself. In January, I set out to learn as much as I could about Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. In doing so, I added some traditions that the church has used for many years, but St. John's had not yet adopted. We started with individual absolution. I was expecting a few people to come forward but nearly the entire congregation came forward to hear the words, "In obedience of our Lord's command, I forgive you all your sins." It was a powerful moment and not something I will soon forget.

We also added the washing of feet. This is a weird thing to do. It is supposed to be weird. Peter himself thought it was weird. Yet we do it because we are making a promise to care for the needs of all people both in our congregation and outside our walls. It was neat to wash the feet of Michael Noll, Drew Catrow, and Thomas Day. It was also humbling to have my feet washed by Mike.

Good Friday is one of those days that the church gathers to pray and contemplate the cross. This year, I participated in the Cross Walk hosted by the ministerium. It is one thing to sit in our sanctuary and contemplate the cross, it is another thing to walk throughout our town, following a large cross and hear the last words of Jesus before his death.

And now, we are in the Easter Season. Once again, we hear how God brings new life into the world, the church, and in our daily lives. We are a people of resurrection, but often we are scared of dying. Perhaps it is because of the events on Good Friday. We often get caught up in the gore and horror of our Lord's death. Death, in that sense, is terrifying. But as a people of the resurrection, we should not fear death because our God promises us new life. What in your life needs to die? What ministry in our church need to die? When we let things die, God redeems them and grants new life.

During this season of Easter, we will hear how the early church did ministry before Christendom. These lessons are important to hear especially as we do ministry in a post-Christendom world. Easter is a great time to talk about new life and new mission because we know God will always have our backs. So that, when we fall and fail, God will pick up the pieces and breath new life back into our ministry.

A blessed Easter to you all! We have a lot happening during the month of May. Consider them and participate where you can.
