2019 COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

July 29, 2019

Meeting called to order by: Rick Losh, President

Members present: Pastor Matt, Rick Losh, Shane Wagoner, Linda Payne, Darrell Propst, Mike Noll, Diane Shewbridge, Jerry Crites, Drew Catrow, Bess Day (Treasurer)

Members Absent: Trey Voorhees, Blaine Wilson, Anne Moore, Jane Kelley **Guest:** Christy Costello, Director, The Mustard Seed

Devotions: led by Pastor Matt

Minutes: June meeting minutes approved as submitted. (M/S/P: Jerry Crites;Drew Catrow)

Request to Council: Christy Costello presented a request to improve playground area by upgrading the fencing both for compliance with inspection regulations and as a safety issue for our children. There is peeling green coating on the fence which leaves sharp edges and potential cutting hazard. Security issues include undesirable persons trying to verbally engage the children or engaging in unsavory activities in and around the parking lot and Martin Street, as well as jumping the fence to get into the playground when children were present. The proposal includes six-foot vinyl fencing (5 foot solid and 1 foot lattice top) around the perimeter as well as replacing some interior sections with 4-foot vinyl fencing. Enough money was raised from the recent Chicken BBQ fundraiser to fund posts, hardware and supplies for the project. Mustard Seed staff will fund one of the gates needed. The cost of the fence panels will be raised by securing sponsorships from local businesses, donations from current and past Mustard Seed parents and church members. Several sponsorships have already been secured. Additionally, a licensed contractor has indicated to Christy that he will donate his time to install the fence. Ms. Costello has contacted the city as well as the Historical Preservation Committee to be sure the proposed project will meet all regulations. A formal request will be made by Christy to the Historic Preservation Committee once church council gives approval to go forward. Motion to table action of this request until the September meeting, pending congregational feedback. During the coming weeks, the congregation will be provided with the project goals, plans, and costs and have the opportunity to comment. (M/S/P: Darrell Propst; Jerry Crites)

Financial Report: The offering was down in June; Endowment investments are up as the market rebounds from last year decreases. Mustard Seed continues to show increases in income over expenses and our original start-up funding is the lowest it has been for many years.

Pastor's Report: June was a very busy month. In addition to the usual Sunday

services, home visitations, council and committee meetings, choir practices, etc., Pastor also attended Synod Assembly & Conference meeting, Vacation Bible School activities, Confirmation Sunday, Father's Day Breakfast and several other pastoral activities.

*Request to use script funds, if needed, to purchase supplies for the Block Party. Much has already been donated but if needed, script monies are requested to be used to finish out the funding for any uncovered expenses. Motion to approve up to, but not to exceed, \$1200 from script funds. (M/S/P: Mike Noll; Linda Payne)

*Darrell Propst will apply for an Action Team Grant of \$250 from Thrivent to help fund the Block Party.

*Motion to reimburse Pastor for 1 night's t lodging traveling to Morgantown and Camp Luther. (M/S/P: Mike Noll; Jerry Crites)

*A Work Day will be scheduled for Sunday, October 13th to take care of some general projects and scrubbing the church facilities. A separate day will be scheduled to revisit painting. A call will go out for volunteers with painting skills and a date/s will be coordinated for painting.

*Shane Wagoner is investigating custom congregational T-shirt costs. The shirts would be for sale to church members and worn at church events like VBS, Block Party, etc. Motion to sell the T-shirts as a fundraiser with proceeds to go towards sending our youth to the 2020 National Youth Gathering. (M/S/P: Pastor Matt;

Drew Catrow)

*Rosalee Ettinger Memorial Contributions totaled \$590. Suggestions are a new ciborium (vessel for holding the communion host) or fair linens to cover the small altar/communion table. Pastor will consult with the family.

*All old wooden Luther Hall dining tables have all been replaced by sturdy, light weight tables. A framed document with donors' names and those who they honor or memorialize will be displayed in Luther Hall.

*Procedures have been worked out by Pastor to adjust the rotation of Church Council Members so that in future years, after a period of adjustments, there will only be 3 council seat terms expiring each year. (Full council has 12 elected members.) This year we have 5 members with expiring terms. The plan going forward will ensure that this situation won't happen again.

*New Member Request. Mr. James Sommer has been attending services and has asked to become a member of St. John's. Prior to retiring, Mr. Sommer was a member of Epiphany Lutheran in Ohio, a Missouri Synod church. Motion to accept into membership. (M/S/P: Jerry Crites; Drew Catrow)

*Request to use script funds, if needed, to purchase supplies for the Block Party. Much has already been donated but if needed, script monies are requested to be used to finish out the funding for any uncovered expenses. Motion to approve up to, but not to exceed, \$1200 from script funds for the Block Party. (M/S/P: Mike Noll; Linda Payne)

*Luther Hall Request: Melissa Shoemaker, a Mustard Seed teacher, would like to use Luther Hall on November 16th for a 25th Anniversary Party. Motion to permit use of Luther Hall for this event. (M/S/P: Diane Shewbridge; Linda Payne)

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Christian Education: VBS went well with attendance of 70+ children. The cost per child for materials, supplies and food was approximately \$25. Next year council will consider asking for donations to support a child for \$25.

Social Ministry: Fifteen members of the congregation went on the D.C. train trip to visit the Supreme Court, Library of Congress, and the African American Museum. A wonderful time was had with much thanks extended to Bess Day or organizing this field trip. Friends Feeding Friends served 82 meals on Saturday, July 27th. (Hamburgers, macaroni salad and watermelon.) Twelve volunteers

reported to help prepare, serve and clean up which was much appreciated. Next Friends Feeding Friends will be on Saturday, August 24th.

Evangelism: on August 11th, more backpacks will be stuffed for the Block Party to be held on Saturday, August 17th. Pastor would like many church members to be on hand to greet and invite people to attend St. John's. Please meet at church at 10:30am on the 17th to receive materials and prepare for the event which begins at noon.

Worship and Music: Drew has nearly finished the data base and organized all of our current music collection. This will be very useful when planning anthems and special programs.

LYFE: A swim party is planned at Pastor Karen Valentines house. LYFE activities will begin again when Sunday on Monday activities start up in the fall. **Property/Tech:** no report

Mutual Ministry: Committee met on June 24th. Christy Costello's leadership of the Mustard Seed has already had a positive influence. The number of home visits to shut-ins was discussed and some suggestions were discussed to help meet this need with less time strains on Pastor. This committee plans to meet quarterly.

Stewardship: A blood drive is scheduled for St. John's (Luther Hall) on Saturday December 7th from 9am – 2pm.

CONFIRMATION PROGRAM OVERVIEW

After a meeting of the different participating congregations, we have drafted a new proposal for a confirmation program that is intended to reach more of our youth at an earlier age with the hopes of preparing them for a life of faith.

6th and 7th Graders: Introduction to the Bible

A youth-group style Bible Study. This would happen once a month at the same time as our confirmation program. The kids would have lunch with the confirmands and then move to the youth group room for a time of games and Bible Study. The goal of this group is to build relationships and prepare them for confirmation so that less attention in Confirmation has to be spent on developing a Biblical foundation so that larger, more important themes around social justice, stewardship, church polity, leadership, prayer, etc can be explored more deeply

Curriculum: Echo the Story from Augsburg Fortress



8th Grade: Catechism

Luther's Small Catechism. Class is once a month for four hours on a Sunday. Lunch starts at 1 pm to allow all congregations the chance to make it on time. Class will end at 5pm. Class time is divided into two parts: Learning and then reinforcement. During the reinforcement time, an activity will be done to help show how what they learned can be used every day in regards to faith. These actives can include a movie with discussion, a field trip, service project, panel discussion, etc.

9th Grade: Final Year of Confirmation

The focus for the final will be the practical nature of ministry, theology, and Biblical studies. Class time and structures will be the same as the 8th grade class. We will be studying things such as the Augsburg confession, key Biblical figures, stewardship, etc. We plan to utilize activities to help reinforce the topic discussed so that when a confirmand completes our program, they will be well rounded in their education and will keep going in their journey of faith.

Location:

Classes will be held either at St. Thomas or St. John's. The goal is to make the switch mid-year.

Materials needed for Class

 A Bible (No KJV or Paraphrased translations such as the Message). We will provide one! Make sure you bring it.
 Luther's Small Catechism (Don't worry, we will provide this too. Just make sure you bring it!)
 A notebook.

Expectations for Parents, Students, and church members: We do not like having requirements because it goes against our doctrine of grace. However, confirmation is not possible unless everyone involved (both parents, students, and teachers) participate in as many activities of our program as possible.
•Attend class when possible. Life happens and there will be times when you can't make it to class, just don't make it a habit. If you miss a class or have to leave more than hour early from class, there will be a written assignment that you must complete before the next class period. They will be available on our website or by sending your pastor an email. •The Confirmation Retreat is important! Please mark the weekend on your calendars.

•Sermon Notes: Need to be done once a month and turned in at each confirmation class.

•Bring your books!

•Be on time.

•Participate in class discussion.

•Serve in Worship

•Parents, we ask that you be open to talking to your children about what they learn. Ask questions and encourage them to share their point of view. You are their role models when it comes to faith so don't be shy in sharing your faith with you children.

•Church members, when you see a confirmand at worship or around town, introduce yourself, talk them about their faith, make sure they feel welcomed and appreciated. We need good role models!

Feast of St. Michael And All Angels

Michael the archangel, captain of the heavenly hosts, is remembered on this day along with the other angels and archangels. The word "angel" means messenger, and in Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. A festival dedicated to the honor of the archangel Michael arose in the fifth century in Rome. Michael is not a saint, but in Jewish angelology one of the four archangels who carry out the will of God. 




PET BLESSING October 6 | 12:30 PM St John's Parking Lot

We will gather on grassyarea of our parking lot for some prayer and barking!


