It was wonderful for drying children's tears and, on occasion, was even used for cleaning out dirty ears....

From the chicken coop, the apron was used for carrying eggs, fussy chicks, and sometimes half-hatched eggs to be finished in the warming oven. When company came, those aprons were ideal hiding places for shy kids. And when the weather was cold, Grandma wrapped it around her arms.

Those big old aprons wiped many a perspiring brow bent over the hot wood stove. Chips and kindling wood were brought into the kitchen in that apron.

From the garden, it carried all sorts of vegetables. After the peas had been shelled, it carried out the hulls. In the fall, the apron was used to bring in apples that had fallen from the trees.

When unexpected company drove up the road, it was surprising how much furniture that old apron could dust in a matter of seconds.

When dinner was ready, Grandma walked out onto the porch, waved her apron, and the menfolk knew it was time to come in from the fields to dinner.

It will be a long time before someone invents something that will replace that 'old-time' apron that served so many purposes."

RESIDENT OF THE MONTH JoMAE DRAKE

JoMae Drake was born JoMae Chase in 1933 in Missoula, Montana. Her father loved to fish and to play violin, and so she was given the love of the outdoors and the love of music. Her auntie and uncle would take her on long camping trips in the summer, and that uncle loved science and astronomy and gave her a love of learning. They would star-watch and discuss science and math together from the time JoMae was very young. Her mother's family had moved to Montana from Michigan where her grandfather was a blacksmith with the railroad, and the family lived in a set of boxcars on a spur of the railroad. Her mother only attended school through the fourth grade, due to the great flu epidemic in Missoula at that time.

As a very young child, JoMae had to stay quarantined for several weeks with her mother because her mother had scarlet fever. JoMae never contracted it, but she remembers the groceries being left at their door while in quarantine. As a child, she greatly enjoyed her pets. She even raised a litter of Pekingese puppies when she was in seventh grade. She had a little brother she played with growing up. He was "like a long string bean" because he was 27" long at birth and eventually grew to 6'7" tall. She remembers trying to squeeze him into a baby carriage with his long, skinny legs and arms dangling out. She loved playing outdoors, making up games and giving the neighbor kids wagon rides. She skated in the winter and loved swimming in the summer. She remembers sledding down the hills above Missoula and returning from sledding one evening to learn of the attack on Pearl Harbor. She recalls the poverty of the war years and how limited their food was. Once, a delivery truck accidentally lost a carton of margarine on the road in front of their car and, although they tried to catch the driver, they couldn't, so they got to enjoy and share margarine with their family and friends ... a real luxury at that time! As a freshman in high school, she broke her leg, got the mumps and had an appendicitis surgery all within a month or two, and it really set her back in school, but she persevered and eventually got caught back up. She played piano throughout her growing-up years in Missoula, even though the family moved over 13 times!

After high school she was a camp counselor at Lake Coeur d'Alene for the summer, and also went on an adventurous road trip with a girlfriend before returning to Missoula to attend U of M. She had to sell her beloved piano to attend the first quarter. She was elected Homecoming Queen as a freshman at U of M and was a Miss Montana candidate that year, as well. She was planning to perform both violin and piano as her talent, but the pageant was canceled that year for some reason. She had to drop out of school that winter quarter and work at the phone company in order to earn enough money to go back to school. She worked an overnight split shift. She and the other girls kept themselves awake by keeping their feet in buckets of ice water. She was able to continue attending U of M her sophomore year where she met her future husband, a U of M law student, Glen Drake. They became engaged in the winter of that year, but JoMae had set her sights on becoming a physical therapist, and so she left for Minnesota to attend school at the Mayo Clinic the fall of her junior year. She still had to work while attending school, and got very little sleep because she worked as a nanny, and at night with the iron lung patients, and still had all her classes and studies to complete. The fall of her senior year at Mayo she got married, and the loneliness of the separation from her husband eventually resulted in JoMae leaving Mayo just one quarter short of completing her physical therapy degree. She returned to Missoula where Glen graduated from law school that same spring.

JoMae and Glen raised a total of seven children, who were born in Missoula, Billings, Great Falls and Helena. They moved along with Glen's work as a lawyer, finally settling in Helena where he joined a law firm and eventually became a two-term Montana state senator.

Meanwhile, despite the responsibilities of raising seven children, JoMae returned to school to complete her elementary education degree. She was the first person in her extended family to graduate from college. She taught at several Helena area schools, one of them being in Elliston, a 60-mile round trip up and over McDonald Pass every day. While there she was also the school principal. Later she continued her studies in special education and specialized in learning disabilities, running her own tutoring business for a few years in downtown Helena. Just after JoMae began her teaching career, her husband Glen suffered a major heart attack during his second term as state senator. As a result, he was very ill and unable to work; therefore, her small teacher's salary was essential to keep the family afloat, as all seven of their children were still in school, the eldest being only 16 at the time. Eventually Glen was able to return to work part time.

Over the next 30 years Glen would continue to suffer with heart disease and multiple open-heart surgeries. JoMae was at his side throughout all of his health struggles. They did enjoy winter trips to the Arizona desert. Both learned to golf and, when all the kids were grown, they moved from Helena to Kalispell, where they retired and lived on a small golf course for about 15 years.

In 2001, when Glen passed away after an experimental artificial heart implant, JoMae relocated to Hamilton to be close to her daughter, Leslie. Throughout her life, it has been faith in the love of Jesus that has given JoMae hope, strength and joy. She has strived her entire life to spread the Good News of Jesus the Savior to everyone she meets. Her seven children all have the same love of learning, love of music and love of the outdoors that Glen and JoMae gave them. Their careers include: Artist/teacher, lawyer, heart stenographer, electrical engineer, businessman, nurse and rancher/wrangler. There are two that became singers, and two others are very accomplished pianists. JoMae has 12 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. Her deepest longing is that all of her descendants might become believers in Jesus Christ.
