Jesus said to them again, “Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, so I am sending you.” After he had said this, he breathed on the disciples and said, “Receive the Holy Spirit. Whenever you forgive sins, they are forgiven....” -John 20:21-23

TAKE PART IN COINS FOR CARENET

Coins for CareNet is a fundraising program that small businesses, church groups, and individuals can participate in. Bottles are provided to raise funds during any period of time. For groups, a duration of one to two months is recommended, such as from Mother's Day to Father's Day. Set up a display at your church or office, or get your small group or family involved. Bottles can be picked up or dropped off at any CareNet office. Small change can make a big difference!

BECOME A CARENET ADVOCATE

So many people in the greater DuPage area are in need of CareNet's love, compassion and practical help—women experiencing unplanned pregnancies, and women or men with an abortion in their past. So many are steeped in a culture that does not value life, and are hurting. Your church and CareNet form a partnership that can help. You can participate by becoming a CareNet Advocate. Advocates learn about our services and are equipped to connect people in need to CareNet through church ministries or in the community.

SPONSOR A LOCAL CENTER

Since over ninety percent of women who visit CareNet come from within ten miles of a CareNet help center, our vision is to provide greater access to our services throughout the DuPage area by adding "express" centers. You can tour your local CareNet center and learn what material or volunteer needs are there. JOIN THE CONNECTIONS MENTORING PROGRAM

Connections brings a group of women in a church together with a pregnant woman in need. The purpose of the program is to form a network of support around a woman and her baby, so that her quality of life is enhanced and her spiritual life is encouraged. Our hope is that as she is embraced by your group, a mom-to-be will form a lasting relationship with your church family. A Connections group also provides a baby shower for the new mother.

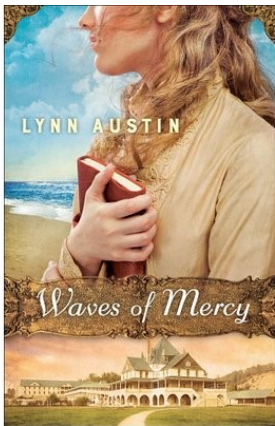
HELP COLLECT NEEDED BABY SUPPLIES

This month we are featuring two of our favorite authors: Tamera Alexander's *A Note Yet Unsung*. She writes about this novel: "In the nineteenth century, women were not allowed to play in orchestras or symphonies. They were considered too genteel and delicate natured for the rigors of practice and dedication required to master an instrument. It was also set forth that a woman playing a violin in public would be scandalous." Into this setting we have a master violinist, trained in Vienna, attempting to audition for a position with the newly formed Nashville Philharmonic. Follow Rebekah Carrington as she struggles to fulfill her dream, and use her musical gifts.



Lynn Austin has touched our hearts with many of her novels. *Waves of Mercy* has two women haunted by the unknowns of their pasts... searching for answers along the shores of Lake Michigan. Anna Nicholson has questions about her newfound faith, and is troubled by a recurring nightmare. Derk Vander Veen, a seasonal worker at Hotel Ottawa, who plans to enter the ministry, is a source of help for her. He also has encouraged his mother to write her memories of emigrating from the Netherlands almost 50 years ago for the Anniversary of the Holland, Michigan settlement. Past and Present collide for these two women in unexpected revelations.

The average cost is about \$5 a load for washing. For people who don't have much money, that can really add up.



We have served in this manner twice in the past, and the reactions were priceless. Most people couldn't believe someone would help them out like that. There were others who didn't want our help because "there



were others who needed it more." We also handed out flowers to all of the ladies (and some men) at each location. There were lots of hugs. We didn't preach, we simply walked around in our Trinity's t-shirts, and let our actions speak for us. On the back of our T-shirt was the printed Bible verse "Serve One Another in Love". It was such a worthwhile project which touched so many people, including those of us who participated, in such a short amount of time (2 hours), that we are doing this again.

THE TRANSFORMATION OF NORMA MCCORVEY

Norma McCorvey, the plaintiff in the infamous Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision that ushered in abortion in the U.S., died last month at the age of 69. As many of you know, she reversed course and deeply regretted her involvement in the legalization of abortion. Her transformation from being adamantly pro-choice to adamantly pro-life did not occur through her coming to her senses and realizing the error of her ways. It began through love and a relationship. She was befriended by a pastor who eventually led her to Christ. She was baptized and began to grow in her relationship with God. As her faith grew, her life was changed and she became an advocate for life. CareNet understands Norma’s conversion very well. Through the unconditional love demonstrated by our counselors, women know that they are cared for and meaningful relationships are established. CareNet knows that only God can change a heart, so spiritual counsel is an important part of a CareNet counselor’s conversation with a woman considering abortion. Every day in CareNet’s counseling rooms, lives are being changed and saved both here and for eternity. We are grateful for the opportunity to dramatically alter the outcomes of women’s lives. As Norma’s life demonstrates, there is nothing God can’t do with an open heart and mind.

The Motto of the Reformation: VDMA

Verbum Domini Manet in Aeternum (The Word of the Lord Endures Forever) is the motto of the Lutheran Reformation, a confident expression of the enduring power and authority of God's Word. The motto is based on 1 Peter 1:24–25. It first appeared in the court of Frederick the Wise in 1522. He had it sewn onto the right sleeve of the court's official clothing, which was worn by prince and servant alike. It was used by Frederick's successors, his brother John the Steadfast, and his nephew John Frederick the Magnanimous. It became the official motto of the Smalcaldic League and was used on flags, banners, swords, and uniforms as a symbol of the unity of the Lutheran laity who struggled to defend their beliefs, communities, families, and lives against those who were intent on destroying them. It was found inscribed inside churches, over doorways, on foundation stones, even on horse's helmets! The VDMA logo and statement has appeared throughout Lutheran churches worldwide and remains an enduring motto of the Reformation to this day.

Several examples of its use during the Reformation era appear below, on a coin, over a doorway in Braunschweig, Germany, and on a clock, and finally, a particularly interesting artifact, a helmet from 1553 that would have been placed on a warhorse, contains the motto.

My dad and his best friend Kent were both born in 1917. They were kids during World War I, worked in CC camps in the 1930's, lived through the Depression and World War II. Both married young. Ironically, both of them lost their brides when they were in their sixties after having been married for forty-plus years. My dad and Kent, high school buddies, re-bonded in their senior single-lived years. They went to Bethel Lutheran Church's XYZ Club (Extra Years of Zest) in Madison, Wisconsin and Friday night dances. They told me how the "girls" outnumbered them ten to one.

Then one day I came home, and Dad said, "Did you hear about Kent?" He went on to tell me how Kent and a single woman had decided to live together. OK, I will not tell you about that German Lutheran background and morals and all that other stuff - you see, my purpose today is different. Kent's life with his new lady friend was spectacular. I saw Kent. He had a prance in his step. He was all smiles from ear-to-ear, as was his wonderful lady. They were busy setting up their new home with furniture, a big TV, car, the whole works. Sell the old, bring in the new. Life is good. And life was good.

Years later, however, Kent's "new girl" died. Kent had three children, all adult of course, and so did she. Did I mention no one did any estate planning? So figure it out for yourself. Who gets that home they put together? And what about the furniture and the wide-screen TV? The money they had set away - whose is it anyway? Did I mention that while all this was happening, Kent, of course, was also grieving? At a time when he was least able to make decisions, he was forced to leave the home that he clearly had contributed to establish. What a mess it was. What pain for not only Kent, but for the six siblings left trying to figure out who should get this or that. A very high percentage of our seniors today are living without benefit of marriage. This article is not a moral article. It is a legal one. I was widowed, as was my father. The purpose is to tell one and all, estate planning is imperative. Do not worsen the excruciating pain of grief because you failed to plan.

But he was also subject to periods of depression and discouragement. On one such occasion his wife, Katie, dressed herself in mourning apparel and fixed a sorrowful expression on her face. When Luther saw Katie apparently overwhelmed with sorrow, he was anxious.

"What has happened?" he asked.

"Alas, the dear Lord is dead," she replied.

"What nonsense," he said. "You know that God lives and cannot die."

"Is that possible?" she exclaimed. "I thought surely He must be dead since you seem so distressed."

The Luther smiled and said, "You are right. I should not be so sad because God -who has been, is, and will be-is always the same, loving God."

We may believe that Jesus Christ rose from the grave, but often we don't act that way. We moan about all the problems in the world. Selfishness dominates our thoughts and actions. How can we be alive in Christ when we act as though He were dead?

Katie Luther was wiser than many of us. In a comical way she reminder her husband that Christ does live, no matter how sad we may feel. He did rise from the grave, just as surely as He mounted the ugly cross to take away our sins. He is with us always as He promised. That never changes.

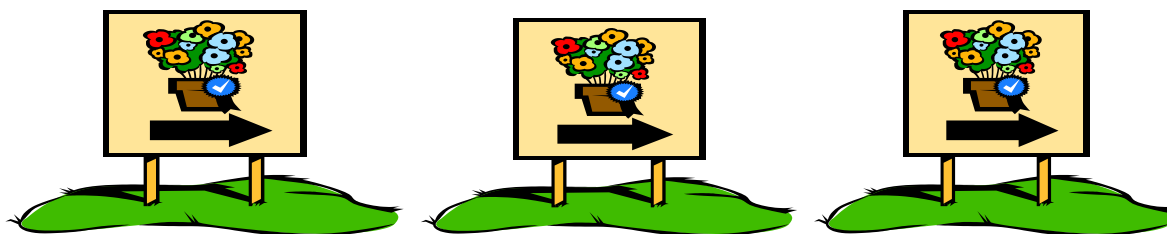
