

Christians and Plastic

Plastic – gotta love that stuff!

Ever since chemist Leo Baekeland invented Bakelite in 1906, hydrochemical (petroleum-based) plastic has been an integral part of life throughout the world. (You would have to be "of a certain age" to actually remember Bakelite, but here's a hint – those heavy black phones in old movies were made of it.) Plastic is in nearly everything we use – from the laptop I am typing this on, to the cars we drive (20% of a car is made of plastic); from jewelry to rocket ships.

The problem with plastic is that every single piece of it ever made (and not recycled) still exists. It takes thousands of years to break down. Some scientists say it NEVER biodegrades. As Christians, we are managers of this beautiful world God has given us. We should do all we can to not spoil it.

It is impossible, I presume, to stop using plastics. But

here are three simple everyday products that we could stop using, or at least significantly reduce our use of.

Plastic shopping bags. Americans go thru an estimated 100 billion plastic shopping bags every year, and only 6% are recycled. Why not get in the habit of taking reusable totes (especially cotton or canvas ones) when you shop? If you do get plastic bags, recycle them.

Drinking straws. In the U.S. we discard 500 million plastic straws *every day*! Each straw is used for an average of 12 minutes, and then thrown away. They are not currently recyclable. Most of the time (for example, in restaurants), straws are simply unnecessary, as are the plastic lids they go through. Simply tell the server, "no straw, please." Of course, there are times, such as while riding in a car, or when flat on your back in a hospital bed, when lids and straws make sense.

Single-use plastic water bottles. Americans throw out *50 billion* water bottles every year. The plastic netting or wrap that the bottles come in is an environmental problem as well. Instead, get a metal or glass refillable bottle that you can use for years. When you do use a plastic bottle (water or soda), recycle it.

8 million tons of plastic waste ends up in our oceans every year. How much more is in our roadsides, rivers and lakes? Be a good steward of our earth – reduce your plastic use, and recycle what you do use.






Rummage Sale: Our annual Rummage Sale is scheduled for the first weekend in August.


The youth will begin setting up the gym beginning July 21. Many volunteers are needed to help set up the gym for this huge sale.


ic store items are on the board. Take one or two slips, buy the item, and return it to the box. Different items will be on the board each week.
