

Radical Gratitude

"Give thanks in all circumstance; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians

December

5:18).

I recently heard a devotion on this Bible verse the day after Thanksgiving. It was interesting to hear this on what we call Black Friday, a day when we tend to go crazy as consumers in preparation for Christmas. So, what does Radical Gratitude really look like?

Radical gratitude looks like the Bible passage above, but most people read it incorrectly. Notice that the Bible says to give thanks in all circumstances, not for all circumstances. There is a huge difference by changing the word in to for. We don't have to be thankful for the bad things that happen in our lives. We know that we see a lot of evil in the world and not everything that happens in the world is God's will. In fact, if you really think about it, most of the time God's will is not done. Our will is done. So, we don't thank God for the evil in the world. We thank God in the middle of it.

Why can I thank God in every circumstance? First, because I know God is in control. I know God can bring good out of evil. I know God can turn even my mistakes into something that works out well – good can come from it. I know that I'm not going to live on Earth forever. I know that I am going to heaven one day. I know I can't love my salvation as long as I stay faithful. I know no matter what that God isn't going to stop loving me. I could think of a lot of reasons to be thankful in any circumstance, even circumstances that are bad.

The verse also says in *all things*. This could also mean any, all, anyone, all the time, anywhere, everywhere, the whole thing. It means no exception, no excuses, no exemptions.

That seems pretty radical, doesn't it? That's why it's radical gratitude.

It doesn't take effort to be grateful for the nice present somebody just gave you. Anyone can do that. But being grateful in all circumstances is radical gratitude.

People say they want to know God's will. They want to know what God wants them to do with their life. Well, giving thanks in all situations is God's will for you!
