

## Stewardship—Trinity People Are Generous!

Trinity celebrated its "Faith Commitment Weekend" on October 7 & 8, and once again demonstrated how many members, and friends, are generous and committed to the Lord's work.

Each year, the Board of Stewardship examines several stewardship programs, and, with Pastor Geaschel's input, selects one that will best serve the needs of Trinity members. This year it was "Defying Gravity: Breaking Free from the Culture of More." This is a timely theme, with America's obsession with constantly acquiring more, newer and better "stuff." Our over-abundance of posses-



sions can drag us down – hence the title, "Defying Gravity." The program challenged us to simplify our lives, disposing of things that clutter our existence, distract us from spiritual things, and stand in the way of being generous.

One unique feature this year, was the opportunity through "the great clean-out challenge," to repurpose a number of things that accumulate around the house – specifically, old eye-glasses, worn out batteries, magazines and tattered flags. Trinity members turned in 110 pairs of glasses, which will be donated to the Lions Club to be used in third-world countries, 19 flags, which the American Legion will dispose of respectfully, two boxes of magazines, which were taken to Hines VA hospital for patients there, and a full box of batteries, which will be recycled.

On Faith Commitment Weekend, and in the several weeks since then, 114 individuals or families turned in Faith Commitment Cards. All told, they committed more than \$416,000 in offerings for the year to come. These commitments averaged \$4,005 over the course of a year. Over 40% indicated that their offerings would be greater than in the previous year. We are very grateful to our members who are honoring God with sacrificial offerings, and are loyal and devoted to the ministries of Trinity congregation!

We are excited to share the good news of Jesus' birth with you as we present "The Colors of Christmas."




## Library Update

Jan Karon fans will be glad to see her new book "<u>To Be Where You Are</u>" on our Featured Shelf. She continues to weave together the richly comic and compelling lives of two Kavanagh families, and a cast of characters that readers around the world now love like kin.

Next is "<u>I, Saul</u>" by Jerry Jenkins. The author transports you from the first century world of Saul (Paul), Luke, Timothy, and Mark, to the life of a modern-day professor who travels the globe to save his best friend's life and is drawn into a search for the secret memoirs of prisoner Paul. - Michael worked on a Scripture app in October that syncs an audio recording of the Komba New Testament with the text verse by verse. The app should be ready for distribution by the end of November. Please pray that it will be easy to distribute and for many people to be able to receive it and share it with others.
- The Komba team began proof-reading the book of Genesis in October and they hope to get the book ready for consultant checking by the end of the year. Please pray for guidance as the team reads through the text together.
- The seasons are changing! The tall grasses are drying and being cut for roofing (left), millet and guinea corn (sorghum) is drying out and being harvested (middle), and the market traffic is picking up with new grains appearing in market (right; This is a van/bus stuffed with people as they head back to their town with goods bought in market on top. Animals like sheep, goats, and pigs make their appearances on top of these vehicles and the goods are known to pile even higher!).
