January 2018

The second King of Rome, Numa Pompilius, added the month of January to the calendar. He named the month after the Roman god Janus, the guardian of doors and gates, beginnings and endings.

The month of January was considered sacred as it opens the door to the New Year and closes the door of the past. As a door has two sides, the god Janus is depicted with two faces (see the Roman coin with the god Janus). The temple of Janus had doors that were shut in the time of peace and open in the time of war. The doors were rarely closed during the history of Rome.



During the time that Rome ruled the war, Jesus was born. Jesus, the Prince of Peace, also associated Himself with a door and with beginnings and endings. "I am the door; if anyone enters by Me, he will be saved" (John 10:9). And again, Jesus said, "I am the Alpha and Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end" (Revelation 22:13).

It is good for us to commit ourselves to Jesus as January 1 opens the door to another year.

Time passes, centuries come and go, empires start and kingdoms fall, rulers die, and sinful idols like Janus are forgotten, but Jesus lives. Jesus is "the same yesterday, today and tomorrow" (Hebrews 13:8).

As the New Year begins, be for Jesus. Thank and praise Him, serve and obey Him. Seek to have the One True God at the top of your priorities. Strive to make Him known with your words and actions. Love others as He has loved you. Be kind and compassionate as He has compassion on you. Worship Him in spirit and in truth.

Janus saved no one. Jesus is the "author and perfecter of our faith (Hebrews 12:2). Jesus is the only way to the father, the only door to eternal life. May He guard and guide us this year and always.

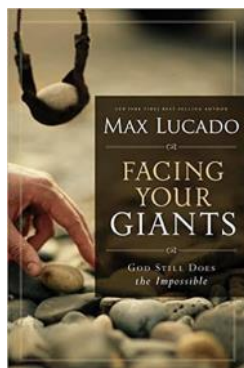

#1—In *"Waking the Dead"* John Eldredge shows us how God restores our hearts, our true humanity, and sets us free. There are four streams, he says, through which we can discover the abundant life: Walking with God, Receiving His Intimate Counsel, Deep Restoration, and Spiritual Warfare. And once the "eyes of our hearts" are opened, we will embrace three eternal truths: *Things are not what they seem. This is a world at war. Each of us has a crucial role to play.* A battle is raging. And it is a battle for your heart.



#2—In *"Facing Your Giants"* Max Lucado uses that example of David and Goliath to help us face our giants...the people you can't please, habits you can't break, failures you can't forget, and a future you can't face. But for those who know the sound of a Goliath, David gives this reminder: Focus on Giants– you stumble. Focus on God– your giants tumble. Let David's story inspire you. You do remember, don't you, the year the Snuggie was a big hit? It was 2009. Although some called it "the most tacky gift of the Christmas season," over four million were sold. And you can still get them! (Walmart, Amazon.com). There's a mermaid snuggie, superhero snuggies, tuxedo snuggies, and of course, the plain old snuggies in a wide variety of colors.

I never had one, but I have to admit, they look comfortable. And we all want to be comfortable, don't we?

Most people have their "church snuggies" – not a physical one, but the things that make them comfortable – routines, friends, style of music or worship, service time... what's your church snuggie? They're OK, I suppose – at least, up to a point – just keep in mind that Jesus didn't say, "If anyone would come after Me, let him slip into his spiritual snuggie and follow me." If memory serves, I believe what He said was "take up your cross daily," or something like that.



We have our "comfort zone" when it comes to giving, too. We would like to be generous (or imagine that we are being generous) – but without really cutting into our decisions about what we do with our money –

our choices in a home or a car, for example, our stops at Starbucks or McDonalds, our Bears or Blackhawks tickets or our trip to Walt Disney World. Or, packing every penny into investments and retirement accounts. So we give what is "comfortable" for us. It's our stewardship snuggie!

I could go on to say that we should step out of our stewardship snuggie, do something Uncomfortable. But what it really comes down to is exchanging one snuggie for another – getting out of our worldly snuggie and into the warm embrace of a loving heavenly Father. When our "comfort zone" consists of money, possessions or experiences, we will eventually find our snuggie worn and thin and cold. But when our comfort is in the power and grace of God, we will be well taken care of!

If our giving isn't a bit UNcomfortable, maybe even scary, does it truly reflect faith in God? May you really find your "comfort zone" in the arms of God!
