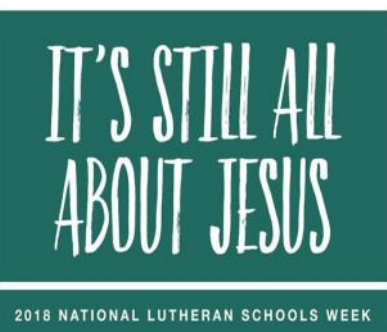
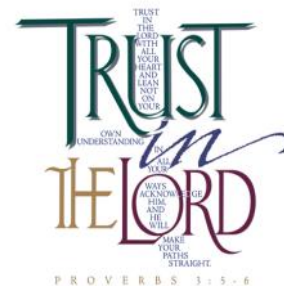
Principal's Page

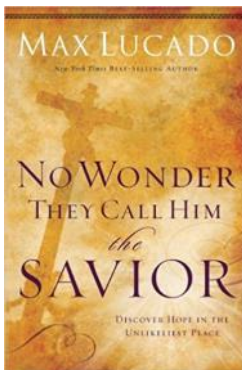
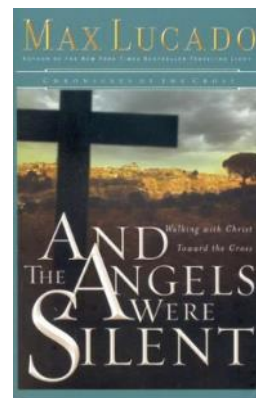

In February we looked at Love from a human point of view. As we move into the season of Lent, we focus on God's love. He writes about the final week of Jesus' life under the title *"And the Angels were Silent"*. We follow his steps and observe him on his final journey. From Jericho to Jerusalem. From the temple to the garden to the trial. From Pilate's palace to Golgotha's cross. It's the final week. All of heaven watches. A hush fell over heaven as the God-man faced his final days. Our focus simply needs to not focus on our differences, but on Christ and his radical love and hospitality for us that makes us one!
