Are you a Sippy Cup or a Soaker Hose?

Growing up in a family with three older and two younger siblings, "spilt milk" was a regular event at mealtime. As a father of five, it happened during my parenting years as well. Then, in the mid-eighties, a new invention revolutionized parenting: the sippy cup! What a great idea! No more "crying over spilt milk!" (or parents yelling about spilt milk!)



Another relatively new invention (I couldn't find a date) is the soaker hose. You know, the hose where no water comes out the end, because it's capped off and the water all leaks out the sides. Seems counter-intuitive, but it is designed to economically deliver water slowly to very selective plants or flower beds.

The sippy cup and the soaker hose could be an allegory of your life. Some people have blessings poured into them – but let none escape. Others "leak their blessings" all over the place!

St. Paul wrote, (2 Corinthians 4:7), "We have this treasure in jars of clay..." The treasure is the Gospel, and the "jars of clay" he was referring to are Christian people, whose task it is to share the love of God. He was portraying himself (and us!) as ordinary (not Ming vases), fragile (sometimes cracked-pots!)...and LEAKY! God fills our lives with His blessings, and we should leak them everywhere we go!

Did you ever find a sippy cup that fell behind the couch...who knows when? Whew! It didn't leak, but the contents are seriously bad. The same happens when we bottle up the good things God gives us – not just the Gospel, but our talents, our possessions, our lives. We need more "leaky Lutherans!"



tions they have received from parents. Some areas covered






If you are interested in these family topics, there are other books available on the shelf labeled "Focus on the Family". This bookcase is located on the south wall of the library.

Some are called to be evangelists—but every Christian is called to the work of evangelism, for every Christian is called to tell others about Christ and what He has done for them.




