How God Uses Money in Our Lives (And How He Doesn't) (Part 1)

Money is a huge part of our lives. We need it to pay our bills, provide food and shelter, educate our children (or pay off our own student debt!), buy us fun, prepare for retirement...pay

taxes... No wonder Jesus spoke about it so often – more than any other single subject!

We might see money as an end in itself, or as a means to an end (security, happiness, love, power, etc.) God sees money as a tool for Him to work in our lives. He also recognizes, more than we do, that it is a temptation that can draw us away from Him. Here are some ways God uses, and doesn't use, money in our lives. (some credit for these ideas is due to Nelson Searcy of the Journey Church in New York.)

- 1. God uses money to strengthen our faith in Him. He leads us to see that money (and every other blessing) comes from Him, our loving and generous heavenly Father. He can also use *lack* or *loss* of money to demonstrate that we do not control our money, or even own it. We discover that we need to rely on Him, not our money, to "get by" and then we see Him provide for us.
 - God does NOT use money to worry us. When we worry about our finances, it reveals that we have not turned over complete control to God. God wants us to know that He provides for all our earthly needs. When we come to believe this, we cease to worry.
- 2. God uses money to develop our trustworthiness. After telling "the parable of the shrewd manager" (Luke 16), Jesus concludes, "Whoever can be trusted with little, can be trusted with much...so if you have not been trustworthy in handling worldly wealth, who will trust you with true riches?" (v. 10-11) To God, money is a "little" thing but its use is one way of demonstrating our values and priorities, our trustworthiness. God does NOT use money to corrupt us. Satan, however, does. Satan deceives us into thinking that money is a "big" thing, and tempts us toward greed, ego, deceit, worldliness, and other snares that are at enmity with God and His design for our lives.
- 3. God uses money to create relationships. In collecting a special offering in Greece for drought-stricken believers in Palestine, St. Paul wrote, "Your plenty will supply their need, so that in turn their plenty will supply what you need." Our generosity, when times are good for us, creates a bond with those in need. Possibly when things are not so good for us, they will return the favor. Sometimes, when our generosity is toward unbelievers, the relationship begun can lead them to see the love of God expressed in that generosity. God does NOT intend money to create walls between people rich vs poor, high class vs low class. Regardless of our level of material blessing, we are all one in Christ, we are brothers and sisters. As such, we care *about* each other and *for* each other.


