How God Uses Money in Our Lives (And How He Doesn't) (Part 2)

By Rev. Mark Bussert, Director of Stewardship

(This is a continuation of an article started last month. We noted that God uses money in our lives to strengthen our faith, develop trustworthiness and create relationships.)

- 4. God uses money to cultivate self-control. Self-control is one of the fruits of the Spirit (Galatians 5:23); as we follow God's guidelines for effective financial management, we learn to return our tithe (or more) to Him first, to save for the future, to live within our means, and to delay gratification.
 - God does NOT use money to induce us to satisfy every personal whim or desire. Though He is very generous to us, He does not intend for us to use His gifts only for ourselves, or all RIGHT NOW. He especially does not desire for us to go into debt to get what we want. Rather, He gives us abundance "so that [we] may have something to share with those in need" (Ephesians 4:28).
- 5. God uses money to clarify our spiritual maturity (to ourselves and others). How we use money is a good barometer of our character. Are we selfish, or generous? Are we disciplined, or reckless? Are we godly, or worldly? It's all visible in how we use money! Jesus said that "no one can serve two masters" (Matthew 6:24). Do you serve God or money?
 - God does NOT use money to turn us to idolatry or self-indulgence. As we become more spiritually mature, more disciplined, more conscious of His Kingdom, He provides the resources to fund ministries of compassion, service and Gospel outreach.

Yes, God has a definite design and plan for money in our lives! Are there areas where He can grow and improve you and your relationship with what He gives you?

Some things change, and others are eternal

This year a long standing CareNet walk site partner in Hinsdale opted to choose a different date on their own later in the fall. This left CareNet without an important gathering site in our geographic area, where more walkers usually join in supporting CareNet's annual Walk for Life.

With prayer, and determined not to be discouraged, this afforded an opportunity to instead go to a walk site hosted by a sister LCMS congregation, Calvary Lutheran Church in Wood Dale, IL. What a blessing! Through past support efforts at Trinity Burr Ridge and from other supporting congregations, Calvary has been able to help many women and children through their Baby Bank. This Baby Bank opens twice per month to moms and babies in need - supplying diapers, wipes, and other material goods, along with spiritual support and a welcoming connection to the community it serves.



Upon checking in for the walk event, in addition to my walk pledges, I brought a bag of hand knitted caps and booties from a friend of CareNet at Trinity Burr Ridge. These were so greatly appreciated – babies saved through God at work in this caring ministry will be born just around the time knit caps and booties a weather necessity for newborns! CareNet asked me to convey thanks for all your support and prayers in addition to our annual baby bottle drive just ending.

At this site, I learned that 417 feet and 7/10 of a mile are important numbers to be aware of. 417 feet is the distance from the small, but mighty, CareNet office to the local abortion clinic - the distance between life and death. 7/10 of a mile is the distance from Calvary Wood Dale to the CareNet office at 132 E. Irving Park Road in Wood Dale. Along the walk route, a sign (pictured below left) on a local Catholic church serves as a reminder that "abortion stops a beating heart".

Turnout was good for the event, despite the very hot weather. Walkers received many thumbs up and waves from the traffic on Irving Park Road. It was encouraging to see leaders and members from our other sister congregations in the LCMS, who are also active in helping to support CareNet's life-saving efforts.

The unchanging is God's gift of life – both physical life and eternal life. We give unending thanks, and lift prayers for the moms that choose life for their babies. We pray that through church connections, they would experience the love of Christ and be adopted into God's family.
