Are You Free?

I have been re-reading <u>Hawaii</u> by James A. Michener, the tale of how the islands that today are our 50th state came to be what they are today. I just finished the section describing how Chinese workers were imported to work on the sugar cane plantations – and how, about the same time, leprosy first appeared on the islands. The native Hawaiian population, isolated there for over a thousand years, had little resistance to diseases brought in from other parts of the world. Between 1700 and 1900, their population was reduced from over 400,000 to under 40,000. With few immunities, they had an above-average susceptibility to leprosy. So when they contracted it, they were immediately sent to the notorious leper colony on the island of Molokai. There, they were prisoners – literally, since they couldn't leave for as long as they lived, and figuratively, prisoners in their own decaying bodies. It was a most dreaded fate. We pretty much take freedom for granted. But are we really free? Some are trapped in debt.

Some are a prisoner of a mortgage or car payment. Some are entangled in an unhealthy rela-

tionship. Some are ensnared in guilt or anxiety. Living in a "free" country, we can still be prisoners!

"Live Free!" is the title of our 2018 stewardship emphasis, beginning on the weekend of September 9th and finishing on the weekend of September 30. We will remember what Jesus has done to make us "truly free." (John 8:36) We will also consider ways to become liberated from things that can trap even Christians – especially "money traps."

There will be two stewardship-themed Bible studies on Sunday mornings (and also a related youth Bible study). Faith Commitment weekend will be September 29 and 30.

Let's discover how to "Live Free!"


Library News

Before we feature biographies of great men, let's look at a book that examines couples: "C.S. Lewis had a Wife: Catherine Marshall had a Husband" by William Petesen. The title is deceiving. We do find these two accounts but it also contains sketches of 8 other couples with historic names like: David and Mary Livingstone, Charles and Susie Spurgeon, John and Elizabeth Bunyan, Billy and Nell Sunday. This book shows us the personal side—the marriages of these people whom God has used. The author adds: "I trust that you will come to know and enjoy these Christian leaders as I have, and that you will also learn from their marriages."



"Presidential Courage –Brave Leaders and How They Changed America 1789-1989" by Michael Beschloss is a brilliantly readable and inspiring sage about crucial times in American history when a courageous President dramatically changed our future.

"7 Men" by Eric Metaxas answers the question: "What makes a great man great?" In captivating stories, seven historical figures come to life as real people who experienced struggles and challenges that probably would have destroyed the resolve of most other men. What was the secret of Washington, Wilberforce, Eric Liddell, Bonhoeffer, Jackie Robinson, Pope John Paul II, Charles Colson?

These books all make me thankful for our Christian heritage and for people who acknowledge, support and defend our freedom. Hope you'll feel the same.

A Model for Christian Worship (Portal of Prayers)

Read Acts 2:42 – 47 ~ Psalm 132

You don't have to go to church to be a Christian. In other words, you don't need other Christians around to prove that you're one of them. Based on this model in Acts 2, we'd have to conclude that this isn't really a very Christian attitude at all. But the trouble is, it's not so easily fixed. You can be a loner at church too. You can attend the service, listen to the sermon, go to Communion, and then slip out at the end as quickly as you slipped in at the beginning. And sometimes, that's just what you need to do.

But when life is normal, the model in Acts 2 applies. It's not about how one Christian lives, but about how all Christians live together in fellowship. There's no teaching alone: that needs at least two people. There's no "breaking bread" alone - then it's just eating to fill your stomach. The prayers are for the people around you in need.

Christian worship is always in fellowship, and it sustains the life of the Body of Christ – A Body make up of many members supporting and carrying one another. And in His Church, your Lord calls you into fellowship with Him and with your fellow believers; He sustains and nurtures you with His love and mercy. Thanks be to God!

Heavenly Father, draw us into fellowship with You and with one another, with your Son at the center. Amen.


New Member—Carmen Mugnolo


