

It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; <sup>6</sup> it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. <sup>7</sup>Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. <sup>8</sup>Love never ends.

Valentine's Day is nearly here. I remember going to the store, picking out a box of valentines, signing my name, attaching some sort of treat and taking them to class the next day. Everyone gave and everyone received. It was a great lesson, we are to care about our neighbors... all of them.

For those who are married, God has called you into a very special relationship of care, one of sacrificial love. A man will leave his family, a woman will leave her family, and they are to be united into a new family with the blessing of our God. First, start with forgiveness. We all need it. Second, respond with kindness – be a helper and encourager, demonstrate your love. Finally, ask God in prayer to bless your relationship.

### **Friday Evening TLC**


TLC Bible Study Group meets in member homes, and is led by Cliff Gustafson (815-372-9937). We continue our study on Prayer. This study will resume in March.

### Love in Action

Since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.

1 John 4:11-12 NIV

Jesus said, "All men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 13:35 NIV). But how do we put that love into action?

Service one another. The Lord modeled this when He washed His disciples' feet. Be patient with one another. This is possible because of the Spirit's presence in us. Be courteous to one another. Even if someone is difficult or disagreeable, treat them with gentleness and love. Set an example for one another "in speech, in life, in love, in faith and in purity" (1 Timothy 4:12 NIV).
