# THE LORD'S

#### THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION AT TRINITY:

SUPPER The Lord's Supper is celebrated in this congregation in the belief and confidence that in this Sacrament, Christ is truly present, giving us His body and blood, in, with and under the forms of bread and wine (1 Corinthians 10:16, Mark 14:22-24). As Christians (and specifically as Missouri Synod Lutherans), we believe that it is through Jesus Christ alone that we have the hope of eternal life. We believe that we are sinners in need of forgiveness and that in the Lord's Supper, God

gives that forgiveness, strengthens our faith, and strengthens our union with Him and each other (Romans 3:23, Matthew 26:26-28). As Christians, we also believe that as we come to the Lord's Supper, we are making a commitment to amend our sinful lives with the help of the Holy Spirit (2 Timothy 2:19, Romans 8:6).

GUESTS AND VISITORS: Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed or confirmed, or who hold to a doctrinal position differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor (1 Corinthians 11:27-29). At Trinity we practice Close Communion as adopted by our Synod in Convention.

ALCOHOL CONTENT IN WINE: The "red" wine in the chalice and in the outer rings of the communion cup tray contains alcohol. The "white" wine in the center of the tray is de-alcoholized wine (alcohol nearly 100% removed). You may use the red or white wine in the tray but please remember that the chalice has only "red" wine with normal alcohol content.

#### Q: Typical question asked by visitors: Can only LCMS members take communion at Trinity Burr Ridge?

A: The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod has never understood or applied the historic practice of close[d] Communion in such a way as to mean that only LCMS members are permitted to commune at LCMS altars. The official position of the Synod is that not only are members of other Lutheran churches with whom we are in altar and pulpit fellowship invited to commune with us, but also that in certain extraordinary cases of pastoral care and in emergencies members of churches not in fellowship with us may be given Communion. The Synod stated, for example, in 1986 "that pastors and congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod continue to abide by the practice of close Communion, which includes the necessity of exercising responsible pastoral care in extraordinary situations and circumstances" (1986 Res. 3-08 "To Maintain Practice of Close Communion"). after the last service on Easter morning, take your plant(s) home with you.



Though she grew up in a pro-life home, Abby Johnson was captivated by the well-practiced talking points of Planned Parenthood representatives who visited the university she attended. In no time, she became a volunteer, escorting women into the clinic. Fast forward, and a few years later, Johnson was one of Planned Parenthood's youngest clinic directors. But everything changed when she observed an in utero baby fighting for life during an ultrasound-guided abortion. After eight years and 22,000 abortions, she could no longer deny the reality that innocent babies were being put to death on her watch. She was done. Today, Johnson is one of the nation's most influential advocates for life. Her 2010 tell-all book, <u>Unplanned</u>, is a dramatic narrative of her journey from an abortion provider to pro-life activist. Parents are advised to see it first and consider watching and discussing it with older children. Cities that are showing Unplanned are Woodridge, Lombard, Orland Park, Naperville and more starting March 29. Text "baby" to "53445" for a 30 minutes sneak peek video.

Most movies have a dropoff in ticket sales during the 2nd weekend and "Unplanned" was no exception. But its 49.9% dropoff was less than the 60.4% dropoff for "Dumbo" and the 58.4% dropoff for "Us" – the 1st and 2nd place movies last weekend. The film earned an estimated \$3.2 million after expanding to 1,515 screens. The controversial film about Abby Johnson, a former Planned Parenthood clinic director-turned-pro-life advocate, beat industry predictions again with a per screen average of \$2,111. Audience support continues to be strong, with word of mouth on social media providing support for the film as well as an unusual A+ rating from CinemaScore. The movie was featured on fewer screens than any other movie in the top 10 last weekend, making it so it would have brought in more ticket sales had it been shown to a larger audience— and it's per screen average would have placed it 7th instead of 8th.


