Imagine being a Disciple and then imagine Jesus Resurrected after you were absolutely certain that He had died. In fact, you were one of the witnesses. You saw the professional Roman Soldiers carry out their duties perfectly. Three people were condemned to die. All three were dead. You saw the spear enter the lifeless body of Jesus. Unexpectedly, Joseph and Nicodemus come forward to start taking care of Jesus' body. They take him from the cross, wrap him quickly in cloths, and place his body in a new tomb at the garden. That would have to be it until the Passover Sabbath had ended.

But as death came for the two thieves who were crucified, one on each side of Jesus, death had no eternal power over the Lamb of God. The Blood of the Lamb was not only spotless, it was pure and innocent. This Lamb, Jesus was perfect. When Jesus took upon himself the sin of the world, he was the perfect sacrifice for humanity. It was a substitutionary moment, once for all. Justice had been served and the penalty paid. Now, imagine seeing Jesus alive... what a sight! What joy and thankfulness to know that you are forever forgiven and that by faith you have exactly what you have been promised, the hope of eternal life – a gift that nothing can take away. Thursday Afternoon

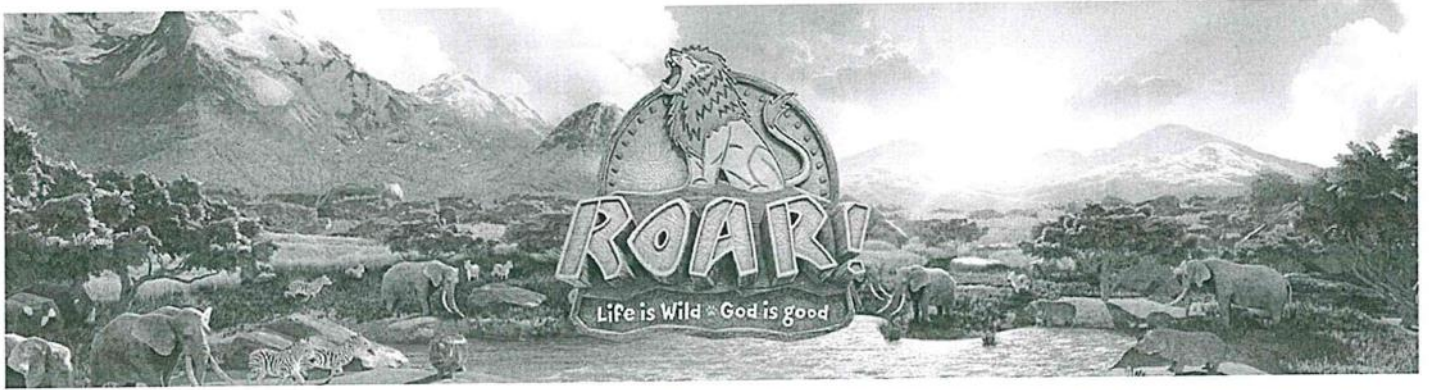
Ladies Bible Class meets weekly at 1:00 p.m. in the home of Susie Carr (630-323-3688).

Deaconess Intern Update

I have been assigned to serve the Northern Illinois District of the LCMS for 10 hours per week helping congregations across the area wherever needed in addition to my regular full-time office assistant position and responsible for an additional 14 hours of work per week on evenings and weekends. In my long hours of study over the past two years - most of my classwork and my field-work training are now complete. I am blessed to have spent some of that time assisting in serving at Trinity Burr Ridge. This congregation will always hold a very special place in my heart for the love and kindness you have extended to me as a stranger coming into your midst. I would cherish the ongoing prayers of the congregation as I embark on an 18 month internship across the area, praying the Lord guides me to serve in the places He has prepared and that I serve the Kingdom faithfully sharing the love and Good News of Jesus Christ as I go.

I will assist with planning an inclusive worship service there on June 9th in the areas of the selection of the readings, music and hospitality outreach and communications. Pastor Heller and I have been reaching out into that community asking the question - how can the church serve your needs? The answers are often surprising and very thought provoking as a church member.

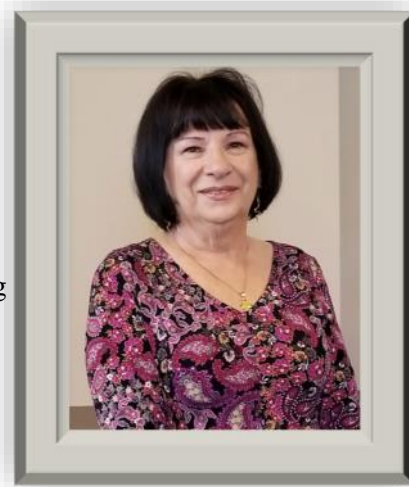

Walther Successfully Completes Capital Campaign

With the grace of God and the support of 395 individuals, churches and organizations, Walther Christian Academy has completed their \$2.3 million dollar *Where Blessings Abound* capital campaign. 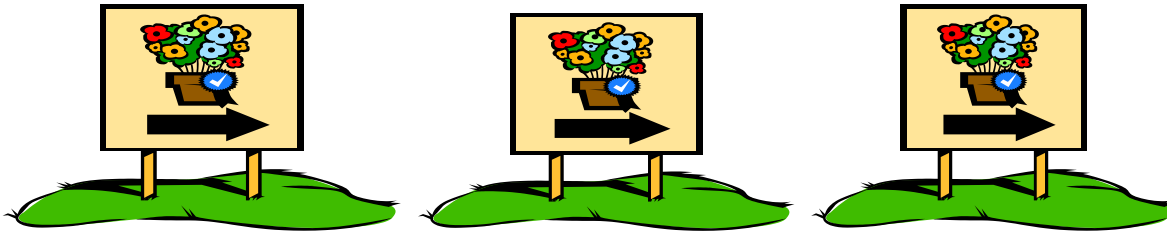

Isn't it wonderful to see the flowers and bushes blooming? A short time ago everything looked dead, but now they are alive with leaves and blossoms. God has done this - just as we were reminded at Easter that He has given us new life through Jesus' death and resurrection.

In fact, God wants each one of us to grow - to have a heart like his. In Max Lucado's "Just Like Jesus" you'll find that "God loves you just the way you are, but he refuses to leave you there." Let his love direct your behavior, his priorities govern your actions, and his passion drive your decisions. His plan is nothing short of total transformation." (This writing is featured in a 3-in-1 book.)

We're also featuring "Seasoned with Salt" by David Roper. Spiritual growth, spiritual awareness is seeing everything through God's eyes, hearing with His ears, responding to others with His love. In this inspiring book, the author challenges us to study God's Word and to "grow eyes". To show us how, he uses timeless examples from the life of the prophet Elisha.

Much of what we learn depends upon listening. We have two books that deal with this. In "When God Whispers Your Name", Max Lucado is nudging us with these words: "Somewhere between the pages of this book and the pages of your heart, God is speaking. And He is calling you by name. Maybe that's hard to believe. Maybe you just can't imagine that the One who made it all thinks of you that personally - that He keeps your name on his heart and lips. But it's true. In the Bible and in the circumstances of your life, He whispers your name lovingly. So listen closely as you read...listen for the Father's gentle whisper."

In "The Sacred Echo", author Margaret Feinberg is also urging us to "learn to listen for the persistent voice of God in our life, so we can walk more confidently and fully into all that he has for each of us." It's an invitation to spiritual awakening and a deeper relationship with God.

Because we are alive through faith in Christ, let's continue to grow in that faith and as God's children.
