The Pesky Warning Light

So annoying! The "low tire" indicator on the dashboard kept coming on. I would check the tires, fill the ones that were low...and a few weeks later, the light would come on again. After a while, I narrowed the problem down to the passenger side rear wheel. I finally took the car to the shop, where they discovered that there was a cut in the tire that was causing a slow leak... and creating a risk for us as we drove it. The warning light was for our own good!

God gives us spiritual "warning lights," too.

St. John wrote, "Do not love the world, or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, love for the Father is not in them." (1 John 2:15) St. John uses hyperbolic language for effect –



he sets up an "all or nothing," black/white choice; of course we can love our children, for example, without jeopardizing our relationship with God. Perhaps we might say "don't *fall in love* with the world..." You can "love" a lot of people, but I think you can only "be in love" with one person!

John warns us that if we are "in love with" the world, we will lose our love for God, and the things God loves. But how do you know if you are falling <u>out</u> of love with God and <u>in</u> love with the world? Here are four "warning lights on your spiritual dashboard."

Warning light #1 – we are falling in love with the world when we are never quite satisfied with what we have. "Whoever loves money never has enough; whoever loves wealth is never satisfied with their income." (Eccl. 5:10)

Warning Light #2 – we are falling in love with the world when the things we own end up owning us. "No one can <u>serve</u> two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Mammon." (Matt. 6:24. "mammon" = "stuff")

Warning light #3 – we are falling in love with the world when worrying about losing our things is disrupting our inner peace. "I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want." (Phil. 4:12) "So Ahab went home, sullen and angry because Naboth had said, 'I will not give you the inheritance of my ancestors.' He lay on his bed sulking and refused to eat." (1 Kings 21:4)

Warning light #4 – we are falling in love with the world when our desire to be with Jesus is diminished by our affection for what we have here. "We are confident, I say, and would prefer to be away from the body and at home with the Lord." (2 Cor. 5:8; see also the Parable of the Great Banquet, Luke 14:15-20)

Are any of these warning lights blinking on your dashboard? Is it time for a tune-up? It is always the right time to turn away from the shiny lights of the world to Jesus, the True Light that came into the world!

Funeral/Memorial Planning






