How our Christian Education programs work together at Trinity:

SEPTEMBER is the month that our Sunday School, Confirmation and Bible Classes resume for all ages. But if you take a closer look, we have a purposeful, year-round education program at Trinity. Each program builds on and supports the others. VBS, Sunday School, Confirmation, Camp Luther, Youth Group, Small Group Bible Study, and Large Group Bible Study. Our education programs work together to create a network of learning in which Christian disciples are raised up and sent to serve God and others.

VBs students are given opportunities to explore their faith through music, games, and crafts, which there may not be time for during the shorter Sunday School class.

SUNDAY SCHOOL students experience God's great love for them in Jesus Christ through biblical literacy. While exploring the Old Testament, students learn why Jesus came to earth, died on the cross, and rose from the dead. This knowledge sets up elementary students for our confirmation program. Before students enter confirmation, they should know Bible basics, God's actions in the Old Testament (Garden of Eden, Flood, Tower of Babel, etc.), key people of the Old Testament (Abraham & Sarah, Isaac & Rebecca, Jacob & Esau, Joseph, Moses, etc.), the History of Israel (including Joshua, the Judges, Kings, the Prophets, Exile and the Return, etc.), the life of JESUS, the stories of Jesus, the Parables, the Miracles, Holy Week, the Early Church and the Acts of the Apostles – all taught during our Sunday School program.

Confirmation classes prepare students to publicly affirm their faith. Students learn why faith matters and how to walk with Jesus throughout their lives, developing a more personal relationship with God. Wrestling with hard questions about faith and seeing how their faith plays out in their daily lives prepares students to personally confess their faith.

Every Christian Education program at Trinity works together to create a community of learning and serving within the congregation. The core teachings of the Bible are the same for preschoolers and for adults. But as we move through different ages and stages, we build on what we have learned and comprehend more of the Bible story each time we return to it.

I encourage every member at Trinity to be active in the Christian Education program at our church. I know that God will bless you as your grow in His Word. In Christ,

Salam has continued to meet on Saturdays at Peace Lombard. We had a picnic to continue to build relationships and provide an opportunity for church members to bring their friends to hear about Jesus Christ. I also took a group on a retreat to Walcamp.

Amir Chehab has been helping me the last five months. The Salam board has decided to contract with him to help me part time. Some of the things he is working on is our website, writing grants, moving furniture, and providing help with social service needs to name a few. Presentation and Display table at Best Practices Heartland Cornerstone Lutheran Church, Carmel, IN Missionary Hesham asked Jonathan, a volunteer with Salam to write about his 8-year experience with Salam:

I met Hesham Shehab in Fall 2010 at Christ Church of Oak Brook (CCOB). They hosted a mission weekend and being a new Christian I was intrigued by Hesham and Salam Ministry.

I had been thinking and praying for over a year for where I could serve God. What would be a good fit for me?

A year later at the 2011 Missions Weekend, Hesham and I spoke again. This time, the conversation lasted longer and he invited me to volunteer at Salam. He believed that God could use me to reach out to Muslims seeking Christ. He said I would be an asset as I

would live among them as an example of a Jew who has been called to faith and baptized in Christ in the twenty-first Century. I attended worship at Salam and had many conversations with members.

I learned that it is not unusual for Muslim Christians and seekers to have a dream or vision. Often they are of a figure dressed in white, who is believed to be Jesus Christ or the Holy Spirit or some other Christian saint. I learned that Hesham was first attracted to Christ because of the message "Love your enemy" in the Sermon the Mount. Many other Muslim Christians have also been drawn to Christ because of the message "Love your enemy."

"Love your enemy" has strengthened my obedience. It has enhanced the meaning of the second part of The Great Command that has become the center of my spiritual and moral life: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

Hesham has mentored me, taught and engaged me in how to care for God's people. I am able to use my life experiences and skills to help with asylum paperwork, Green Cards and Employment Authorization Documents. I have been able to assist refugees in getting Medicaid, Medicare and healthcare. I view my role as an ombudsman as I organize, explain things and help with interactions of members of Salam with the US healthcare system.

Hesham has asked me to help a Pakistani man who was baptized the week before, fill out his asylum application. It was challenging as the deadline for filing was a month away and I was not familiar with this form.

The man and I worked side by side and we were able to finished the twelve-page form within a week. Hesham has asked us to re-write the application because it was not clearly explained that if the Pakistani man returned to Pakistan his life would be in danger. We needed to give examples of how the Islamic extremists threatened his life and tell that if he returned as a baptized Christian he most likely would be harmed or killed. With the help of a person that spoke the native language of the man I was helping, we were able to get his frightening stories. The Pakistani shared that Pakistani Muslim extremists were keeping track of his Sunday church attendance. They made threats by calling his cellphone and continued to do so after he arrived in the US.

Praise God! In late 2015 he got an Employment Authorization Document. He was now allowed to work legally in the United States.

Two years after the Asylum Application was submitted an asylum hearing was held and in 2017 the application was approved. Now his wife and 2 young children could be declared derivative Asylees. They were able to enroll their children in school, where they did quite well. I am still helping the family get Green Cards for permanent legal US residence.

Volunteering with Salam has made believe that miracles are possible today... only because "Jesus is the same; yesterday, today, and forever. God is truly great and I thank Him in the name of Jesus Christ through the work of the Holy Spirit who guided this man and me in this process. I am forever thankful to Hesham and to God for using me in this way.



The Passage of Time

While cleaning and reorganizing my work files this past month I could not help but notice God's faithfulness throughout all of the paperwork I have kept that go back to the start of my "prison days." Has it really been 33 years in prison? 35 years in ministry? How can this be? The time has passed so quickly. What an understatement.

The journey of my ministry work at Stateville is as rich and diverse as the men and women and youth I worked with these many years. The work includes different class curriculums I developed for different security units at the facility, cell house notes regarding counseling with specific inmates and assignments from students who attended classes over the years. Assignments I cannot part with because they are personal and gut wrenching at times, full of the truth of the lives these individuals have lived. There are the names of staff who understood what we, the church, stood for and ensured that the ministry could happen within the walls of each prison I served. I have nothing but gratitude for the people who kept me working in this place through their support in the way of financial help, prayers, letters and cards of encouragement telling me to fight the good fight. Most of all, I am grateful to our God who has called me, sustains me and has given me my life's work. It is a privilege to bring the light of God's love and the fullness of his grace into this place each week. May this good work continue through God's faithfulness and grace along with the urgency that life demands as time passes so quickly. Thank you for enabling my mission work to succeed through the years!

God calls us! Where is he calling you today? Know that wherever that may be God will make a way through the obstacles, past the naysayers and through the maze of life (2) He is faithful. I enjoy singing old hymns in my early morning devotional time. Hark the Voice of Jesus Calling brings everything into focus before I leave for the day!

Hark the voice of Jesus calling, "Who will go and work today? Fields are white and harvests waiting, who will bear the sheaves away?" Loud and long the master calls you; rich reward he offers free! Who will answer gladly saying, "Here am I. Send me, send me."

Up Date - Classes:

My Houses of Healing class took a break in July and will resume in August. This month I took more time in the cell houses with individuals and met new inmates along the way. A recent conversation with an inmate reminded me of why the message of the church is so powerful these days, we were speaking about the issues of the day, race relations, the struggles of the poor, the violence incited by hateful speech as well as guns. The conversation turned to Jesus, what would he do? I offered up the passage from Romans that all have sinned (Romans 3: 23-24). Perhaps the greatest justice of all is to see what WE have done and what Christ has done for us. Whether our weapon of choice is hateful words or guns. Sin is sin, God's grace is God's grace. No one is better than another and the fight for true justice is never ending. The church needs to be a beacon of hope in our country these days and role-model one of the greatest mandates to love that Jesus gave: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and mind and your neighbor as yourself." Luke 10:27



Life & Liberty Guest Speaker: Rev. Dr. Peter Scaer

Dr. Peter Scaer is a Professor of Exegetical Theology at Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana, where he has served since 2000. He specially focuses on the Gospel or Mark, highlighting the sacramental ministry of Jesus, and loves to show how the life and teachings of Jesus anticipates and forms the life of the Church.

Dr. Scaer completed his undergraduate studies in the Classics at the University of Indiana Bloomington, and from there went to Concordia, receiving his Masters of Divinity in 1992. After receiving a Masters of Arts from Notre Dame in 1995, where in 2001, he completed his doctoral dissertation on the Lukan Passion Narrative. He also served as the pastor of Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Arcadia, Indiana from 1996 through 2000.

Deeply involved in life issues, Dr. Scaer is president of Allen County Right to Life and a founding member of Shepherds United, an ecumenical Christian group formed to defend life, natural marriage, and religious liberty. He speaks out on the issues that affect both the Church and society, always placing the focus on Christ, who gives us life and defines for us what it means to be truly human.


Library Update






