¹⁶ For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. ¹⁷ For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, “The righteous shall live by faith.” – Romans 1:16 and 17

We celebrate the Reformation in October. This year we mark the 502nd anniversary of Luther nailing the 95 Theses (statements) to the church door in Wittenberg, Germany. This church door served as the theological university bulletin board. The statements that Luther posted were written in the language used by the university faculty, Latin. They were translated and printed into German by a local printer and passed out among the people without Luther’s direction or consent. Thus, a public discourse began on the topic of indulgences (forgiveness received by an act of giving a money gift).

Here’s the question. Can we be saved by our money gifts? Can we be saved by any work of ours? Does God need our gold and silver to cover the sin that we carry in our bodies? Do the gates of heaven open because of my purchase of an indulgence? The authority given in the indulgence was the authority of the Roman Pontiff. The Pontiff, and the Pontiff alone, claimed authority to grant forgiveness for this special time of giving. He also granted indulgences for the dead. Anyone who purchased an indulgence for the dead was assured that their loved one sprung from purgatory and entered into heaven just as soon as their money hit the money collection box, *as soon as the money in the coffer clings, the soul from purgatory springs!*

Luther suggested that if the Pope has the authority to release all souls from purgatory, then why does he not release them all freely right now out of compassion and love?

Luther realized that we are saved, not by gold or silver, but by the precious blood of Jesus. Consider these Bible passages:

John 3:16 English Standard Version (ESV)

¹⁶ “For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.

Ephesians 2:8-9 English Standard Version (ESV)

⁸ For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, ⁹ not a result of works, so that no one may boast.

It is Jesus who saves us. His Body and His Blood are the gifts of redemption. By faith in Jesus we are saved. We could never earn or pay our way into heaven. It is never by our own doing. God loves you and He loves the world. Trust in Jesus and be certain of your salvation.

October is the beginning of a very busy time for the Ladies Aid of TLBR. We had our first meeting following the summer break. We began with prayer, and a plentiful hostess table with appetizers and desserts. We then welcomed newcomers, had devotions, committee reports, old and new business, closed with the Lord's Prayer, and had plenty of time for joyful fellowship.

Our purpose as a church ministry can be found on the TLBR website under "Ministries" and reads as follows: *"Ladies Aid Society invites women to be of service at funeral luncheons, hosting coffee hour on Sunday morning, or helping with Project Compassion (bringing meals to shut-ins or those recently home from the hospital). We host an annual Rummage Sale with the help of the Youth Group. We have a Holiday Market with various vendors in November with a tasty lunch and bake sale. We host an Advent Tea in December. Our members decorate festive tables for an evening of Christian fellowship. We support TLBR in other ways when the opportunity arises from cookies/bake sales, potlucks or Easter/Xmas gifts for shut-ins. Ninety % of our funds are spent on our own Trinity causes. Ten % (or more) is set aside for outside charities and mission project."*

Mostly recently, we hosted a seminar (titled "Clear the Clutter") with a guest speaker titled. Since it overlaps with the printing of this month's *TORCH*, we hope to report it was well attended, informational and helpful to all who attended. It's pretty "neat" (no pun intended) that this presentation happened a few short weeks before our Rummage Sale. You can "clear your clutter" and donate it to our rummage sale taking place on Friday & Saturday, 10/25-26. Check the weekly announcement for drop-off times.

The Holiday Market is set for Saturday, November 16, in the school gym. There will be a variety of vendors, a lunch and bake sale. We have the space for a few more vendors. Please contact Nancy Bordak for more details.

"Live Simply!"

We have begun our 2019 Annual Stewardship Emphasis, "Live Simply." This is Year 2 of a four-year series, which began last year with the program, "Live Free." Remember? St. Paul wrote, "For freedom Christ has set us free" (Galatians 5:1) – our Lord desires us to be free from fear, free from guilt, free from death, free from selfishness, and free from a thousand earthly things that chain us down.

One of the things that steals freedom is complexity – life today is very complicated, much more so, it seems, than it was for our parents or grandparents. Some complexity is beyond our control (say, doing our income taxes! Or trying to fix a car that is now governed by computer chips), but we have also complicated our lives, unintentionally perhaps, by many of the decisions we make. The homes we buy, and the possessions we fill them with, all require maintenance and protection, and eventually either replacement or disposal. Not to mention paying for them in the first place, often with consumer debt. As someone has said, "We buy stuff we don't need with money we don't have to impress people we really don't like!"

During this year's Stewardship Series we will be looking at ways to simplify our lives, and we are inviting you to think of, and implement, concrete steps to do so.

Why? Well, of course, complexity is stressful for most people. Simplifying life leaves most people with more peace, more joy. Also, the complications of life are a distraction from doing things that are more important. St. Paul urges us to "take hold of the life that is truly life" (1 Timothy 6:19) – that implies that there is "life" (fix the car, pay the bills, mow the lawn, do the laundry) and there is that which is "truly life." He doesn't define this, but no doubt he is referring to the aspects of life that Jesus desires us to have – peace, joy, contentment, service, compassion, generosity, to name a few.

What will you do? Can you think of ways of simplifying your life? Can you identify things that cause stress or distract you from the most important things in life?

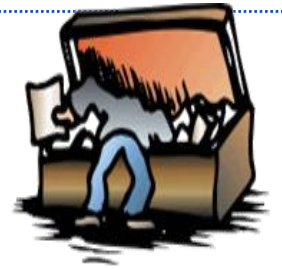

Word of Hope

As a ministry of **Lutherans For Life** (LFL), **Word of Hope** is a unique 24/7 national hotline devoted to intervening on behalf of life issues and imparting the value of all human life as divinely created and redeemed by Jesus Christ. Hotline callers are primarily men or women who have suffered for weeks, months, or years after participating in an abortion decision. Many of the hurting people describe overwhelming guilt, depression, anxiety, nightmares, intrusive thoughts, unwanted memories, or other symptoms of post-abortion syndrome. At **Word of Hope**, we respond to suffering with love, mercy, and confidential support, guiding each person with the Word toward reconciliation with God by the gift of faith in Christ alone.

At the peak of the ministry under founder Grace Kern, MSW, as many as 300 people connected with **Word of Hope** through the hotline or email each month. Over time, the ministry's effectiveness was impacted by the need for Grace to singlehandedly operate the hotline, write literature, speak publicly, and procure funding. Grace's decision to retire meant some tasks needed to be deferred and others postponed as the pursuit for a new director commenced. In April 2017, the search concluded when Deaconess Chrissie Gillet, PsyD, accepted the invitation to join the LFL team as the new **Word of Hope** Director.

The transition presented an opportunity to reflect on past successes and a vision for the future. **Word of Hope** aspires to be a national resource that offers supportive referrals and a Christocentric experience, with the hope that all people will be liberated from the overwhelming guilt associated with life-related issues, such as the suffering connected to abortion. To proceed in harmony with the vision, the focus of our efforts must address the need for knowledgeable staff, an online presence, updated technology, proper referral resources, revised publications, and collaboration with other agencies. Due to the generosity of grants from organizations and donations given by additional dedicated supporters, we accomplished many goals to publicize the hotline. **Word of Hope** increased staff hours, acquired advanced software technology, revised media, exhibited at several conferences, and developed an informational packet that is being distributed nationally. Our ability to **"have mercy on those who doubt [and] save others by snatching them out of the fire"** (Jude 1:22-23a) is critically dependent on the compassion from people and organizations who also share in the true value of life. We are eager to partner with you—For Life!

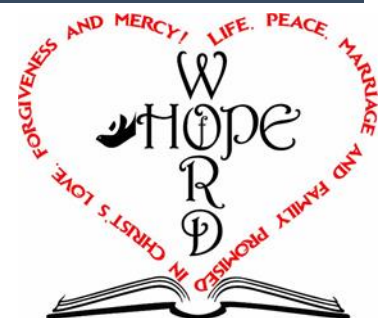

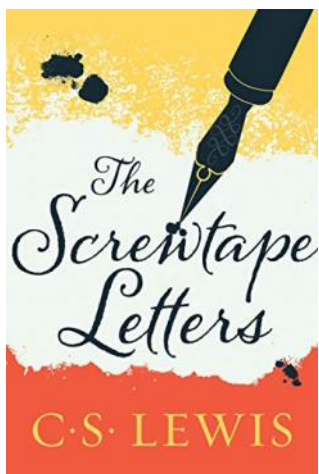


Library Update

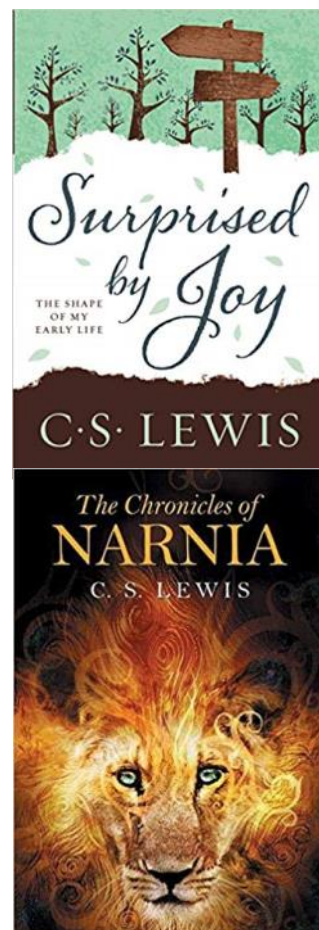


"The Screwtape Letters" -- Wormwood, a young devil, receives these letters from his uncle, Screwtape. They are aimed at training him for his career of tempting humans.

Let's all enjoy the imagination of this well-known author.

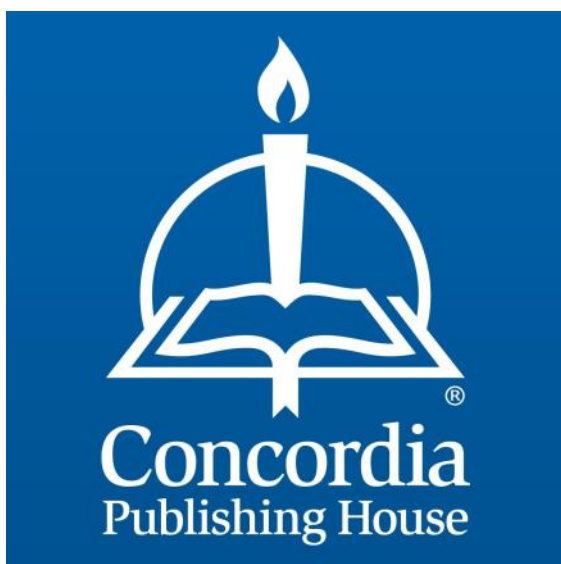

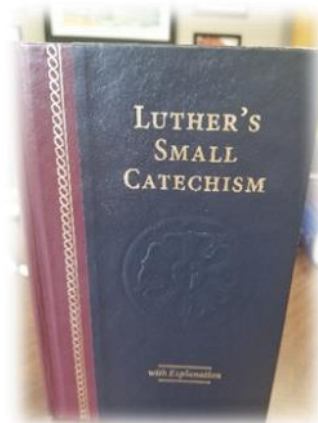
