January 2020

What New Year resolution will you make? How about one that will benefit you and your family...

Psychoanalyst Erica Komisar, writing in *The Wall Street Journal* on December 5, put her finger on a current cultural dilemma. Her column began, "As a therapist, I'm often asked to explain why depression and anxiety are so common among children and adolescents. One of the most important explanations--and perhaps the most neglected--is declining interest in religion. This cultural shift already has proved disastrous for millions of vulnerable young people."

Komisar offered this evidence, from a long-range Harvard study of 5,000: "Children or teens who reported attending a religious service at least once per week scored higher on psychological wellbeing measurements and had lower risks of mental illness. Weekly attendance was associated with higher rates of volunteering, a sense of mission, forgiveness, and lower probabilities of drug use and early sexual initiation."

Her conclusion: "Pity then that the U.S. has seen a 20% decrease in attendance at formal religious services in the past 20 years, [and that] nearly half of adults under 30 do not identify with any religion."

A great New Year resolution would be to attend worship more consistently and to make sure our children and grandchildren are involved in Trinity Lutheran School, Sunday School, VBS and Youth Group. Secular evidence proves the benefit of worship. Biblical wisdom has always encouraged and commanded worship – for in our Divine Service (Worship), we receive God's Good Gifts in His Word and Sacrament. Very important gifts of love and forgiveness.

Church is the place where we hear, over and over again, that we are loved and highly valued by our Creator. It is the place where we learn that God actually does something for us – He takes on human flesh, to pay the penalty--that justice demands--due to our sin. God's forgiveness at the Cross of Jesus is pure gift. Jesus is God's gift to us. Please pass this gift on to the next generation, it is a spiritual and a physical blessing.

The Eighth Commandment


You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.



A common resolution made at the new year is to spend more time with Our Lord and Savior through a stronger devotional life. Excellent! But where to start? Resources for daily devotion abound!!!

Our church library has some great One Year Devotionals!



<u>Guide Me Ever</u> and <u>Guide Me, Lord</u> are collections of Portals of Prayer. <u>Every Day</u> <u>with the Savior</u> is also written in the same tradition.

All of these are also available digitally through Kindle or iBooks, and all are published by Concordia Publishing House (www.cph.org).

Additionally, CPH has several marvelous resources that are all related by use of the same daily lectionary found in the Lutheran Service Book: <u>A Year in the Old</u> <u>Testament, A Year in the New Testament, A Year with the Church Fathers</u>. Each of these incorporates a reading from the New Testament, the Old Testament, and a Psalm and includes a brief meditation. <u>A Year with the Church Fathers</u> features both famous and lesser known Fathers and serves as a reminder that, as part of a family of believers that spans centuries and continents, we all encounter the same issues as we strive to be faithful ambassadors in a fallen world until our Lord brings us home. These are all available as books or digital media. Also using the same lectionary, is <u>Treasury of Daily Prayer</u>. Scripture readings, prayers, psalms,


hymnody, writings from the Church fathers appointed for each day work together to deepen reflection and encourage personal devotion. This is a deeply enriching resource that can assist you in developing a regular pattern of prayer and devotion throughout your whole day. While the book form can take some getting used to, my favorite part is it comes as an app! The "<u>Pray Now</u>" app (\$8.99) for Apple or Android is fabulous!! Putting this resource together as an app for the tech-minded was a brilliant move.

A few other edifying daily resources to consider (Published by CPH): <u>To Live with Christ</u> by Bo Giertz - Written by the Swedish pastor who journeyed from atheism to Lutheranism each reading points to the forgiveness and atonement Christ won for you.

<u>God Grant It</u> from C.F.W. Walther - The founder of our Synod speaks with directness about our human condition in these readings taken from his sermons. God's Truth proclaimed here is as applicable today as when Walther first proclaimed it 150 years ago.

Day by Day from Martin Luther - Daily reading from Luther's Works encourage and point us to Jesus and His Gospel.

<u>The Lord Will Answer</u> - This daily resource can be used in addition to all the above because time spent in the Catechism should never be confined to the time of Confirmation, but rather serve as a foundation we build upon our whole lives. (If you want to spend time in the Lutheran Confessions this year, including both the Small and Large Catechisms, try https://www.bookofconcord.org/ for daily readings, apps, and audio resources.)



Jesus Still Call Sinners to Faith : Hana's Baptism

Salam

The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me." Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." (John 1: 43-46)

This year a North African lady named Hana, 24, won a Green Card (U.S. residency) through lottery, but she had no relatives living in America. She did not know anyone in the U.S. who could help her move out from her country of origin to the Land of the Free and the Home of the Brave.



It was one of those divine interventions when, one day, she met, Fatima, one of her compatriots on WhatsApp.

Fatima, 50, who was baptized through Salam ministries, has been coming to Salam Christian Fellowship for three years. She offered to help Hana relocate in Chicagoland. Hana thought that Fatima was a Muslim like her, but she discovered that Fatima was going to a church called "Salam". Hana asked: "What is Salam?" Fatima replied: "Come and see." Hana was confused. This preacher was talking about a Jesus different from the "Issa" she heard about in Islam. She wondered how could God have a Son? What is the Holy Spirit the preacher is talking about? Islam denies the crucifixion of Jesus and says that a look-alike took his place on the cross. But that preacher was saying that He died for our sins, rose from the dead, and who ever believes in Him and confesses Him as Lord and Savior will have eternal life. The preacher gave Hana a copy of the New Testament in Arabic, a copy of Luther's Small Catechism in Arabic, and told her that he would try to answer any questions she had. Reading and studying the Gospel took two months. Fatima answered more questions asked by Hana than the preacher did.

One day Hana was reading the Gospel alone in her room, when she heard "the Voice of God re-reading the same Gospel verses" in her ears. Hana was not asleep, she was awake, and it was broad daylight.

"For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast." Ephesians 2: 8-9

The Word of God gave Hana peace and assurance of her salvation, something she could not find in Islam.

Hana was baptized into Jesus Christ on October 19, 2019.

"He saved us, not by the righteous deeds we had done, but according to His mercy, through the washing of new birth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. This is the Spirit He poured out on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Savior," Titus 3: 5-6 -Amen-
