Happy New Year! May 2021 be a blessing as you grow in your faith and relationship with our Savior! A common resolution made at the new year is to spend more time with Our Lord through a stronger devotional life. Excellent! But where to start??? Fear not! Devotional resources abound!!!

First, our church library has some great One Year Devotionals:

<u>Guide Me, Lord (this title is not available digitally)</u> and <u>Guide Me Ever</u> are collections of Portals of Prayer. <u>Every</u> <u>Day with the Savior</u> is also written in the same tradition.

New this year is <u>Unveiling Mercy: 365 Daily Devotions on Insights from Old Testament Hebrew</u> by Chad Bird (1517 Publishing, 2020). Written for the English speaker and not the Hebrew scholar, the author serves as a guide who will lead you through the mansion of the Old Testament, filled with Hebrew treasures, to point out and explain their value to you. Yes, by the end, you will know much more about Hebrew, but, more importantly, you will know far more about Jesus, which is the true purpose of the devotional. He explains everything about each day's Hebrew word in clear and understandable ways. Experience "Aha! moments" as you trace connections between the Old and New Testaments. The Christ-soaked scrolls of the Torah, Prophets, and Writings show us who the Son of God is, and how He was both active and foreshadowed in Israel's history and Scriptures. <u>Unveiling Mercy</u> will lead you from January 1st with Genesis 1 through those Old Testament scriptures ending with Malachi 4 on December 31st. Along the way, each devotion will present you with a little Hebrew gift to show how all the parts of the Old Testament usher us to the Messiah.

<u>Day by Day</u> from Martin Luther - Daily readings from Luther's Works encourage and point us to Jesus and His Gospel. These brief daily readings sound as if they were just written yesterday. They are as relevant now as when first penned. Why not enjoy a little Luther this year?

> Dear friends and family, (By Michael)

Greetings to you during this Advent season! In the Northern Hemisphere the days are getting shorter and the darkness seems to subsume more of our world and life. Amidst the year of 2020, it seems like some people see the darkness ever increasing. I recently heard a news report begin by telling me that we have no hope.

When we look at the state of the world, it is easy to focus on the darkness in our lives. Personally, I mourn the daylight which leaves us this time of the year. I was recently reflecting on this and on Christmas time in Gbintiri. I was reminded of a hope-filled message I want to share with you.

I think it was during one Christmas convention I found myself sitting with my friends. We had a full day of worship and fellowship time. Now, we were gathered for more singing, dancing, and a devotion. The local pastor gave a message from Isaiah 60:1-3, "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD rises upon you. See, darkness covers the earth and thick darkness is over the peoples, but the LORD rises upon you and his glory appears over you. Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn."

Living near the equator, the amount of sunlight does not change much throughout the year. The sun usually rises within the vicinity of 6AM and sets around 6PM (give or take 30 minutes). Flashlights, houselights, and streetlights become necessities if you want to do anything after the sunset.

There we were, sitting under a light with darkness an arm's reach away, listening to the message. There is hope! Our light has come! Jesus was born! Those walking in darkness have seen a great light! Nothing can overcome us. Nothing can separate us from God. Jesus has entered our world and we see that Satan and all the powers of evil could not overcome him. Jesus fought Satan and won!

Our joy erupted after the message and we danced to the vibrant drums as our hearts pounded with the hope of light in our lives. Night may have fallen upon us, but the light of Christ brought the light of the noon day as we danced and sang. We are people with hope.

This pastor's message now revisits me years later. In a world where it is easy to feel enclosed in darkness, I am reminded that the darkness is a shadow, a weak silhouette. The light shining behind the shape is Christ, the light that has come and which is coming again. I hope this pastor's message of hope may bring light to you today in this Advent season. We remember the day is coming, Christmas Day is drawing near. We are called to live as people of hope in a world with darkness. The news may say there is no hope in our homes, but as we look to Christ, we see this is a lie. Christ has come. He died for you. He lives. He gives you new life. You are precious and His. May God be with you and provide you with hope as we remember Jesus, the Light of our lives has come to save us from the darkness of our sins and this world! Merry Christmas!

The translators have been hard at work this year and it looks like the remaining books of the Old Testament should be drafted by the end of the year! We have a lengthy ways to go on team checking and consultant checking. Thank you for your partnership with us in this ministry throughout this past year. You have been a blessing in the lives of many people, sharing the light of hope you have in Jesus with others!

Preschool Outdoors at Trinity, Burr Ridge-NIDnews.org



At Trinity Lutheran School in Burr Ridge, preschool looks a little different this year.

Every day, Leann Dewitt's classes meet under an outdoor canopy for instruction. They wear coats and hats in the chilly autumn air. The sounds of wind and traffic hum in the background as Leann leads the fourand five-year-olds in the songs and rhymes they know so well.

Attending the virtual Play First Summit over the summer, Leann had heard educators from around the world talk about the importance of independent play in young children's development.

"One of the things I learned was when adults step



back, kids step up," says Leann. "I think that's so important. Before, I was trying to help [my students] with every little problem that they had. But if you step back and see if they try to work out their own issues, they can most likely do it. And of course you step in on those times when they need help."

"Every day I came home, she had more and more stuff to tell me. She was just on fire with positivity... with what she wanted to do with the outside classroom," says Andy Dewitt, Principal at Trinity and Leann's husband. "Her theory has always been a play-based model. It made it an easy transition, really, to be outside."

The presence of the COVID-19 pandemic provided further reason for moving a classroom outside, as open-air spaces are associated with a lower risk of infection. The children wear their masks when receiving instruction in close quarters.

Parents and students have both responded positively to the new classroom format. When asked why he looked so dejected leaving school one day,

one student said, "There's no school tomorrow." The plan is for class meetings to remain outside if the weather is 20 degrees Fahrenheit or over. Leann diligently reminds parents to make sure their children are appropriately dressed for whatever the weather brings.

One of the best parts about teaching outside is the connection with God's creation. Pastor Bob Geaschel says, "From Old to New Testament, God reveals himself as the one true God by declaring, 'I am the maker of heaven and earth.' You can go to Isaiah 44, 45, and you can see where God says, 'I am the Lord; there is no other. I have made the sea and all that is in it, and the earth is formed by my hands.' God describes Himself as the true God through His creative action. What an awesome thing to have a Christian preschool outside, interacting with the creation of God, which reveals His existence!" For Leann, the greatest success is that the kids are happy, healthy, and growing. "It's them being able to just be themselves and use all of their energy and not be in tight quarters inside playing on a rug playing with toys. They're able to be just children."

Life Sunday Calvary Lutheran Baby Bank update - by Deaconess Lori Trinche

Something both beautiful and tragic happened at the Baby Bank yesterday. Moms were served with love, showered with prayer and care – diapers and wipes, baby food and formula, clothing, toys for the children and Arch books to share God's Word. I received notes of gratitude and several pictures capturing the love and joy that are a lovely reminder of the impact of this ministry. **One note to pass along** from the grandmother of our recent twins, Chase, and Carter, who were preemies we prayed for back when it was expected that one of the boys would be born with a serious heart defect and mom asked for our prayers to carry close to term. "Merry Christmas to you, your family and the Church congregation. So grateful for all of you that serve the Lord's children."

We have recently had to for the first time reach out to another non-Lutheran congregation to get help in sending volunteers as we do not have any young people or young families serving in the ministry. We have had to recruit from neighboring LCMS churches to stay open. Several of our newer volunteers have stepped back especially recently during the pandemic because they are in the most at-risk category.

During the pandemic we have been blessed by donations, we are grateful to Immanuel Hillside, and friends from Trinity Burr Ridge and Grace Western Springs, so the cupboards are well stocked. Christian Fellowship Church in Itasca has recently added to this with extra abundance.

What has been missing is the personal connection to the church so that the women have a place to worship, women's Bible studies to attend and youth activities available for the children to share love and fellowship with others and learn God's Word. Calvary is one of only a handful of Lutheran congregations in our area that partners with a local crisis pregnancy in the unique opening of its doors to serve women and children in crisis pregnancies, showering them with love and grace.

Our last Baby Bank at Calvary Wood Dale will be on February 18th and the first opening at the new location at Christian Fellowship Church in Itasca on March 6th which is my birthday and a day that I normally would be serving these moms with joy. They will likely have more than enough volunteers to serve the needs of the moms, so a full transition of this ministry is currently planned.

Please pray for Pastor Heller in the transition of this ministry to the non-LCMS church nearby that has a large group of volunteers anxious to love and serve these moms and babies, and active intergenerational family ministries to gladly, and with grace, adopt these moms into their hearts and church home.

Pastor Heller has faithfully served for at least 13 years in opening their doors at Calvary - his passion for life ministry has been a personal inspiration to me. His own key volunteers have moved due to health reasons and the operation would have closed without the pleas for help from the women it serves. I have worked over the past two years to help get the word out and generate interest and appreciate many from our congregation stepping forward.

May God teach us something in this and enable us to do better in engaging our next generation of Lutherans to serve in ministries upholding the sanctity of human life, so that they learn firsthand how precious life is from our very conception, actively seek ways to serve in compassion for the at-risk and most vulnerable at both ends of life - all to the glory of God and increase of His Kingdom. We must continue to speak up and actively stand up For Life.

Reflections from Deaconess Elly


"... Thy people shall be my people, and thy God my God" (Ruth 1:16)



- <u>A Year in the Old Testament</u>, <u>A Year in the New Testament</u>, <u>A Year with the Church Fathers</u>. Each of these incorporates a reading from the New Testament, the Old Testament, and a Psalm and includes a brief meditation. <u>A Year with the Church Fathers</u> features both famous and lesser known Fathers and serves as a reminder that, as part of a family of believers that spans centuries and continents, we all encounter the same issues as we strive to be faithful ambassadors in a fallen world until our Lord brings us home.
- <u>To Live with Christ</u> by Bo Giertz This book is fantastic! It is a daily devotion book following the historic lectionary by one of the great lights of confessional Lutheranism in the 20th century, Bishop Bo Giertz. He is best known in our circles for his book, The Hammer of God, but he's written many wonderful works. Written by the Swedish pastor who journeyed from atheism to Lutheranism, each 2-page reading points to the forgiveness and atonement Christ won for you. *This book follows the church year, not the calendar year*.
- <u>The Lord Will Answer</u> This daily resource can be used in addition to all the above because time spent in the Catechism should never be confined to the time of Confirmation, but rather serve as a foundation we build upon our whole lives. *This book follows the church year, not the calendar year.* (If you want to spend time in the Lutheran Confessions this year, including both the Small and Large Catechisms, try https:// www.bookofconcord.org/ for daily readings, apps, and audio resources.)
- <u>God Grant It</u> from C.F.W. Walther The founder of our Synod speaks with directness about our human condition in these readings taken from his sermons. God's Truth proclaimed here is as applicable today as when Walther first proclaimed it 150 years ago. *This book follows the church year, not the calendar year.*

All of these suggestions are brief and enjoyable for daily use. The books are available in our library. Kindle or iBooks versions also exist online. Each was published by Concordia Publishing House (<u>www.cph.org</u>).

A few other edifying resources to consider:

- <u>Meditations on the Gospels: According to His Word</u> First published by Concordia in the 1940s, the devotions in this book are based on the complete text of the four Gospels. They discuss the Gospel writers who they were, why they wrote and they reflect on the text to deepen our understanding. Published by CPH and available in our library. Kindle or iBooks versions exist online.
- <u>A Year in the Gospels with Martin Luther</u> is not a daily devotional, but rather a weekly one. With longer selections, this 2 volume set offers the opportunity place yourself in a pew in Germany as Martin Luther preaches powerful, blunt sermons for each Sunday. A real treat! *This book follows the church year, not the calendar year*. Published by CPH and available in our library. Kindle or iBooks versions exist online.
- <u>A Year of Grace</u> with sermons by Bo Giertz is also not a daily devotional, but rather a weekly one. You will find that Giertz never pulls punches. He preaches the Law without compromise, but just when the Law has done it's work, he applies the Gospel. (2 book set) *This book follows the church year, not the calendar year.* Published by 1517 Publishing and available in our library. Kindle or iBooks versions exist online.

Everything mentioned here is available as a physical book and digital media, so you can enrich your faith at home and on the go. This year take time to spend with the One who will be with you all 525,600 minutes!

Finally, a recommendation for an app: The "<u>Pray Now</u>" app (\$8.99) for Apple or Android is fabulous!! It is the app form of the <u>Treasury of Daily Prayer</u>. Scripture readings, prayers, psalms, hymnody, writings from the Church fathers appointed for each day work together to deepen reflection and encourage personal devotion. This is a deeply enriching resource that can assist you in developing a regular pattern of prayer and devotion throughout your whole day. Putting this resource together as an app for the tech-minded was a brilliant move.

Please feel free to speak with your library representative should you have questions regarding any of these resources. God bless you as you grow in your love and knowledge of Him.

Remember, your church library is always here to assist you with tools and resources to aid in your Christian walk. However, in compliance with CDC guidelines, we are not allowing anyone to remove books on your own, at this time.

Dear Friend of BEDS Plus,

My name is Miriam Martinez, and I work primarily with clients who have experienced family violence and find themselves homeless. I want to share the story of one family who came to us after seeking political asylum, fleeing domestic violence, and becoming homeless in the middle of the COVID19 crisis. Their story is about surviving and pursuing a dream.

Laura, now a single parent of two, was issued a work visa but denied political asylum. She was a nurse in her home country and hoped to find similar work in the U.S., taking educational courses and practicing English to achieve her dream. As in so many families who experience domestic violence, the abuse was not apparent at first, but increased over time. Last spring as the COVID19 crisis intensified, Laura recognized that for the safety of her children and herself they had to leave. With help from local law enforcement, Laura and her children found shelter with a domestic violence agency that referred the family to BEDS for housing services.

COVID19 restrictions were in full force when Laura came to us, but that did not discourage her from working tirelessly to qualify for housing. Despite some hesitancy in leaving the safety of the shelter behind, Laura believed her example would help give her children the strength to one day become independent. Because of her determination, Laura's family was housed within a week of qualifying for transitional housing assistance.

Today, Laura is working as a teacher's assistant for children who are bilingual in Spanish. Already, she is paying a portion of her rent. She continues to work on her English language skills so that she can pass a nursing exam and become truly self-sufficient. Her children have settled happily into their new home. I continue to check in on the family and their progress, and I have 100% confidence that they will soon be independent and flourishing on their own.

Laura's journey would not be possible without transitional housing assistance. According to HUD, Transitional Housing is designed to provide homeless individuals and families with the interim stability and support to successfully move to and maintain permanent housing. **BEDS receives funding for its Transitional Housing program** from a number of sources, including a three-year award from the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority that specifically assists Victims of Crime, such as Laura. Less than one year into the program, 12 households are on their way to independence.

If you are homeless, you don't need virtual help. You need people like the dedicated BEDS Plus staff and volunteers who provide essential services every day, taking every precaution to protect themselves and others from COVID19.

FAMILY HOMELESSNESS

Today BEDS serves almost five times as many children in families as we did in 2016. Across the country, family homelessness has been increasing for a number of years due to the lack of affordable housing, growing income inequality, and the trend towards low-pay service sector jobs without benefits for those without skills, training or education.

At BEDS, our priority is to protect families who are facing homelessness through Prevention and Stabilization, Shelter that accommodates the needs of homeless families, and dedicated Housing programs that give families the time they need to rebuild their lives. Family Transition Shelter is the most recent addition to the menu of family services BEDS offers. La Grange Area Transitional Housing supports families for up to 24 months while they prepare for independent housing. Family Transition Shelter places homeless families in apartment units leased by BEDS to give them a homelike environment as quickly as possible. Families have the option to assume the lease at six month intervals, as they stabilize and increase income.

The COVID19 crisis exacerbates challenges for children in poor and homeless families. Poverty, homelessness and hunger have been shown time and again to negatively impact academic performance. Traditional schooling for homeless children is often interrupted and delayed, and they are twice as likely to have a learning disability, repeat a grade or to be suspended from school. Remote learning requires computer technology, high speed internet, quiet space to do school work, and a strong support system for successful learning at home.

Please take a moment to consider the more than 500 children in our care. We need your support to provide the services that will help their families return to housing and stability.

Trinity Members Come Through Again!

In spite of everything – and you probably know what I mean by "everything" – the members and contributors of Trinity have once again outdone themselves! In a year that has not only seen many infections and deaths from the corona virus, and a severe economic impact on restaurants, theaters, airlines and numerous other businesses, you have continued to return offerings to the Lord and supported the ministries of Trinity. As of the end of October, offerings are about \$21,000 (3.7%) ahead of the same time last year. Usually I like to see a 5%-6% increase...this year 3.7% thrills me!



In addition, you have responded generously in our annual Fall Stewardship Emphasis, "Live Generously," exceeding both the number of Faith Commitments turned in last year (113 this year vs. 109 last year) and the amount of offerings committed (\$446,625 vs. \$439,884). 29 (27%) return a tithe or more. More than 40% indicated an increase in their offering for the year to come. Under the circumstances, I consider this astounding and heartening.

We could take credit for being generous, but really this is the work of the Holy Spirit, who creates and nurtures faith in our hearts. It is not possible for us to be this generous without faith! Without faith, we are selfish and fearful. Once we know that God provides for us and meets all our needs, we are enabled to give freely. And when we realize the depth of His love for us – that "He spared not His own Son, but gave Him up for us all" (Romans 8:32) -- we are motivated by gratitude and love to give offerings to Him.
