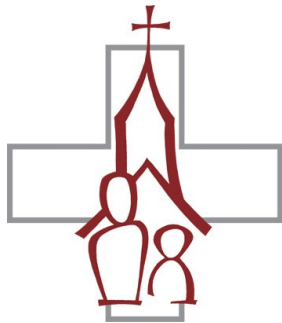

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION AT TRINITY

*The Lord's Supper is celebrated in this congregation in the belief and confidence that in this Sacrament,
Christ is truly present, giving us His body and blood, in, with, and under the forms of bread and wine.*

(1 Corinthians 10:16, Mark 14:22-24)

As Christians (and specifically as Missouri Synod Lutherans), we believe that it is through Jesus Christ alone that we have the hope of eternal life. We believe that we are sinners in need of forgiveness and that in the Lord's Supper, God gives that forgiveness, strengthens our faith, and strengthens our union with Him and each other (**Romans 3:23, Matthew 26:26-28**). As Christians, we also believe that as we come to the Lord's Supper, we are making a commitment to amend our sinful lives with the help of the Holy Spirit (2 Timothy 2:19, Romans 8:6).

GUESTS AND VISITORS

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed or confirmed, or who hold to a doctrinal position differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the Pastor (**1 Corinthians 11:27-29**). At Trinity we practice Close Communion as adopted by our Synod in Convention.

ALCOHOL CONTENT IN WINE

The "red" wine in the chalice and in the outer rings of the communion cup tray contains alcohol. The "white" wine in the center of the tray is de-alcoholized wine (alcohol nearly 100% removed). You may use the red or white wine in the tray but please remember that the chalice has only "red" wine with normal alcohol content.

TYPICAL QUESTION ASKED BY VISITORS

Q: *Can only LCMS members take communion at Trinity Burr Ridge?*

A: *The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod has never understood or applies the historic practice of close[d] Communion in such a way as to mean that only LCMS members are permitted to commune at LCMS altars. The official position of the Synod is that not only are members of other Lutheran church with whom we are in altar and pulpit fellowship invited to commune with us, but also that in certain extraordinary cases of pastoral care and in emergencies members of churches not in fellowship with us may be given Communion. The Synod stated, for example, in 1986 "that pastors and congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod continue to abide by the practice of close Communion, which includes the necessity of exercising responsible pastoral care in extraordinary situations and circumstance" (1986 Res. 3-08 "To Maintain Practice of Close Communion").*

COVID WORSHIP UPDATE

The Board of Elders have decided on the following measures:

COMMON CUP: The Common Cup (Chalice) will be offered for those who desire to use it. Individual cups will always be available. The plastic communion cups that contain both bread and wine will be used at the afternoon services as well as the Monday even service until our supplies are used.

AFTERNOON COMMUNION: Afternoon Communion will continue on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.

MASK POLICY: Mask wear is recommended in the sanctuary. The Pastor and Elder will continue to wear a mask during Holy Communion distribution. The air system and ceiling fans will remain on during worship, and the UV air-cleaners under the balcony will remain. Mask wear is required in the narthex.

SEATING: Every other pew will continue to be restricted from use. We will continue social distancing through August. At the August Elders' Meeting, this will be re-evaluated.

HYMNALS: Hymnals will return to the pews, but the bulletins will continue to print each hymn. Hymnal use is optional at this time.

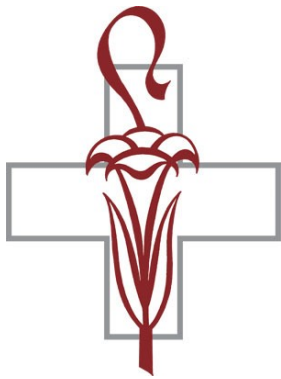

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Greetings in the name of our Lord!

I wanted to remind you of our Tuition Reimbursement Incentive Program, or TRIP. Many, many families in past years have had hundreds of dollars savings from their tuition payment.

The official title of this program is Great Lakes Script. What is the TRIP program? TRIP/SCRIP is an organization that sells gift card to help non-profits earn money. We promote this program to raise money. This is how it works.

When we get our percentage from SCRIP, we return 75% of that money to the participating parents to help reduce their tuition. Trinity school uses 25% for shipping costs and the tuition assistance fund. When a non-school family purchases cards, 100% of the money is used for tuition assistance. When you purchase gift cards, you get the whole amount on the card + and we receive a percentage back.

It is entirely up to you how much you use TRIP. The more you order, the more money you will earn back. It is an easy program to use. SCRIP online offers credit card usage. You might earn points personally there as well. New last year, is the RaiseRight mobile app. You can sign in with your same ShopWithScrip username and password and access your gift cards right away.

Our next school order is DUE by 9:00 a.m., Monday, Oct. 4. When you order, you are helping Trinity. Go to shopwithscrip.com to get started!
