General Conference is the top policy-making body of The United Methodist Church. It is the only entity that speaks officially for the church. The General Conference meets once every four years. The conference can revise church rules, as well as adopt resolutions on various moral, social, public policy and economic issues. It approves plans and budgets for church-wide programs.

The General Conference will meet in Portland, OR May 10-20, 2016. There are 864 delegates from each annual conference around the globe. In 2016, 58.3% of the delegates are from the United States.

As one of the delegates elected from Michigan, I'd invite you to learn more about General Conference and I ask for your prayers for the General Conference.
