Lola Children's Home is the brainchild of Abebe Fantahun, an orphan from Tigray who lost his parents in the famine. As an orphan himself, Abebe feels a calling to help kids in the same predicament. Working as a social worker at one of Addis Ababa's only HIV-positive orphanages, he felt a specific commitment to children with HIV. He decided to return to his birthplace and serve the local children as the founder and director of Lola Children's Home.

Lola Children's Home began as an orphanage for children affected by HIV. It quickly grew to encompass children from the community, and its mission was redefined. Instead of simply housing children, it would care for orphans in addition to assisting local families.

Countless numbers of parents were murdered, handicapped, or reduced to poverty. Predicated upon this, an unbelievable number of children were orphaned or left without needed parental support, a situation that led to most of them children to the streets.

Ebola only added to the numbers of orphans.

The Liberia Annual Conference, United Methodist Church, practicing "A Christ Centered Church" initiatives as a means of not only preaching the Gospel, but also giving hope to humanity, initiated the establishment of an "Orphanage Home" to help our society cater to some of the future leaders. We have seen and known what it means to have kids (God's Creations) sleep outside under public market make shapes and the street corners and surviving on arms purchased bread, not dreaming of an education because it was far away from reality. It was more than Godly and appropriate to act. With donors help, we acted; and it was rewarding and not only lives but also society and generation are being saved. —
