# Vital Church Initiative (VCI)

The VCI study team recently read Unbinding the Gospel – Real Life Evangelism, and then met in Howell with teams from five other United Methodist churches to discuss the book. We spent time working through our thoughts and feelings about the word "evangelism" and how it can sometimes feel negative and judgmental as TV evangelists and people passing out pamphlets and pushing their version of faith come to mind. And then we considered the author's definition, "Evangelism is anything you do to help another person move closer to a relationship with God, or into Christian community."

We were challenged to consider why we find it easy to share stories about watching a great movie or trying a new restaurant, while often finding it much harder to share our faith story. We learned about motivations for evangelism and typical barriers, and how a growing relationship with God is the essential first step.

In addition to discussing Unbinding the Gospel, our team has been examining demographic reports of Chelsea to learn about the major life groups in our area. Life groups represent distinct behavior patterns, relationships, social values, attitudes and world views. Each life group yearns to experience God in ways that are relevant to their life situation, so understanding the demographics of an area is important in planning meaningful worship experiences.

You are invited to learn more about the demographics of Chelsea and join in the conversation of how this data can help inform our worship planning at our next Town Hall meeting on Sunday, March 12<sup>th</sup> from 4:00 p.m. - 5:30 p.m. in Grams Hall. Please join us!


