# Holy Conversation on Human Sexuality, Saturday, June 17<sup>th</sup>,

#### 10:00 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. Grams Hall

Please join in a time of "holy conversation" at CFUMC.
This event has one purpose: to remind ourselves and to help us practice what Christ teaches us about how to live together in community. We are ONE in Jesus Christ.
"Holy Conferencing" is a way for us to embrace our unity, in spite of the differences that push and pull and tug at us. It is a way of conversing with each other that allows us to speak honestly, listen well, and maintain our faithful understandings, while still honoring, respecting, and loving those who are in the Body of Christ with us but who hold widely different understandings of faithful Christian living than we do.

Rev. Melanie Lee Carey will be our facilitator. She will be using a format which was developed by United Methodist laity and clergy from across the state of Michigan and from various perspectives on the topic of human sexuality.

The purpose of this holy conferencing is not to present material or information from any particular perspective, but rather to provide space for conversations around a topic of great interest and attention in our society. We are aware that faithful United Methodists do not all agree on this subject, yet as the Body of Christ, we seek to understand and respect one another. This holy conferencing is a long-standing tradition of our denomination, particularly when we talk and listen with one another on matters in which we have differing viewpoints. Our bishops and the lay and clergy members of our annual conference sessions continue to encourage us to create opportunities for these conversations to take place in our faith communities.

We encourage high school youth and all the various ages of adults to join in this time of "holy conversation." Thank you to those who attended the Faith in Action Banquet and Auction Fundraiser on Saturday April 29<sup>th</sup>.

Early results place the total amount raised at an all time record - ~ \$61,000. As warmer weather settles in, the City of Chelsea now asks for the late payments owed by clients who were unable to pay their bills over the winter. Shut off of utilities occurs only during warmer weather and Faith in Action aids those who are unable to cover the amount owed. It has also been reported that the number of children in the Dexter/Chelsea area are among the top ten in the state to receive reduced or free school lunches.

The middle school youth raised money through the sale of nuts to address a concern of theirs, care for the earth.
