A note about September 10th Children and Youth Ministry Sunday!

On September 10th we are having a special service for Children and Youth Ministry Sunday. Since we want all adults to remain in the service, including BLAST leaders, we will be having a "welcome week" instead of the regular BLAST class format. We will be having stations for the children to rotate between: music, mission craft, food, storytelling, and games. We will have "guest" adult leaders present at each station, and youth to supervise the children and help them rotate among stations.

We would like all youth and adults to be able to attend the service at either 9 a.m. or 11 a.m. Middle school youth will be asked to attend the service at 9 a.m. instead of leaving for programming. High school youth will be asked to attend the 11 a.m. service in lieu of youth programming. We have arranged it so adult BLAST leaders do not have to leave with the children at 9 a.m., but of course they are welcome to assist the children at 9 a.m. and attend the service at 11 a.m. if that is what they choose.

Preschool children may either go to the preschool room for childcare (we will have the nursery workers in the preschool room that day), attend the welcome activities with the big kids, or remain in service. Now here is the easy part:
