Being a follower of Christ is a life-long journey. Whatever our age, we long for opportunities to grow in faith and understand more deeply “how to” be a disciple of Jesus. I invite you to try out one of these groups, as one way of nurturing faith:

John: Gospel of Light and Life

The Gospel of John is one of the most beloved books of the Bible. In this 7-week study/discussion group, we will look at the major themes of John’s Gospel and how we find abundant life in Christ.

The Life and Message of the Apostle Paul – Paul was profoundly influential as a teacher and missionary in the early Christian church. Five Love Languages for Children

This 6 week class will begin on September 24th at 4:30 pm in the lower level conference room but may continue in subsequent weeks outside of the church in members’ homes. Marriage Retreat

Information presented in this class is based on over 4 decades of research by Drs. John and Julie Gottman who are considered relationship experts. In this shortened version of *The Seven Principles of Making Marriage Work* conference, you will learn what elements are necessary for a healthy relationship and skills to cultivate some of those characteristics. The class will be a little bit of lecture and a lot of “couple time” as together you practice skills and dialogue about how to strengthen your relationship.

Benefits of Participation in this Class

- It is encouraging to be with other couples who are also working on improving their relationships.
- It is lighthearted and less threatening than therapy, but may also be a bridge to therapy if needed.
- It helps couples articulate goals, expectations, and time frames for working on their relationship in a positive way.
- It encourages both partners to work on the relationship rather than on their partner.

The retreat is being offered by Marla Field, a licensed therapist on staff at Thriving Minds Family Services in Chelsea. She is trained in the Gottman Method for Couples and also draws from her personal experience of over 27 years of marriage.
