CHELSEA FIRST UMC HISTORY CORNER

DID YOU KNOW? The original church was built on land donated by Elisha Congdon and was dedicated on September 8th, 1859. However, tragedy struck on January 8, 1899 when the entire church was destroyed by fire. The congregation immediately set to the task of rebuilding on the same site. About 13 months later, on February 15th (some accounts say it was February 25th), 1900, Reverend B.I. Ives once again returned to Chelsea from Auburn, NY to be present at the dedication of the new church building. Now nearing 118 years later, we continue to worship in the same beautiful church building. Next time: Where did all the rock come from to build the church?

Interested in Early Response Training?

Michigan Disaster Coordinators announce four Early Response training sessions this fall. Early Responders are trained volunteers who are deployed in the early stages of a disaster. They are an important part of the United Methodist Volunteers in Mission (UMVIM) program.

The Early Response Team (ERT) training prepares individuals to go into the affected area for three days after a natural disaster has hit to help families begin the process of putting their lives back in order. The work of the ERT is to "be a caring Christian presence in the aftermath of a disaster".

Caring presence takes several forms. Early Responders work with families to make their home and yard safe by picking up debris, tarping roofs, removing and sorting items that were harmed, tearing out damaged carpet and dry wall. It may also include mucking out a basement or cleaning where mold has begun to grow. This is a significant ministry that begins the journey back to normal for those affected by a disaster.

The Disaster Response Team of the Michigan Area is setting up ERT sessions. Here's what's on the calendar so far.
