DID YOU KNOW? After the original church building was lost to fire in January 1899, it was quickly decided to rebuild on the same property. Stone was the material of choice for the new church. Local farmers generously donated stones from their fields. Many wagons and teams of horses were used to haul the stones in. The keystones over the windows were all cut from one massive rock taken from the farm of Tom Sears, which is located at what is now 14200 Chelsea-Dexter Rd. Michigan Disaster Coordinators announce four Early Response training sessions

Early Responders are trained volunteers who are deployed in the early stages of a disaster. They are an important part of the United Methodist Volunteers in Mission (UMVIM) program. The Early Response Team (ERT) training prepares individuals to go into the affected area for three days after a natural disaster has hit to help families begin the process of putting their lives back in order.

The work of the ERT is to "be a caring Christian presence in the aftermath of a disaster". Caring presence takes several forms. Early Responders work with families to make their home and yard safe by picking up debris, tarping roofs, removing and sorting items that were harmed, tearing out damaged carpet and dry wall. It may also include mucking out a basement or cleaning where mold has begun to grow.

This is a significant ministry that begins the journey back to normal for those affected by a disaster.

The Disaster Response Team of the Michigan Area is setting up ERT sessions. Here's what's on the calendar so far. All trainings run 9a.m. to 5 p.m.
